a silver tiger up in my tree!

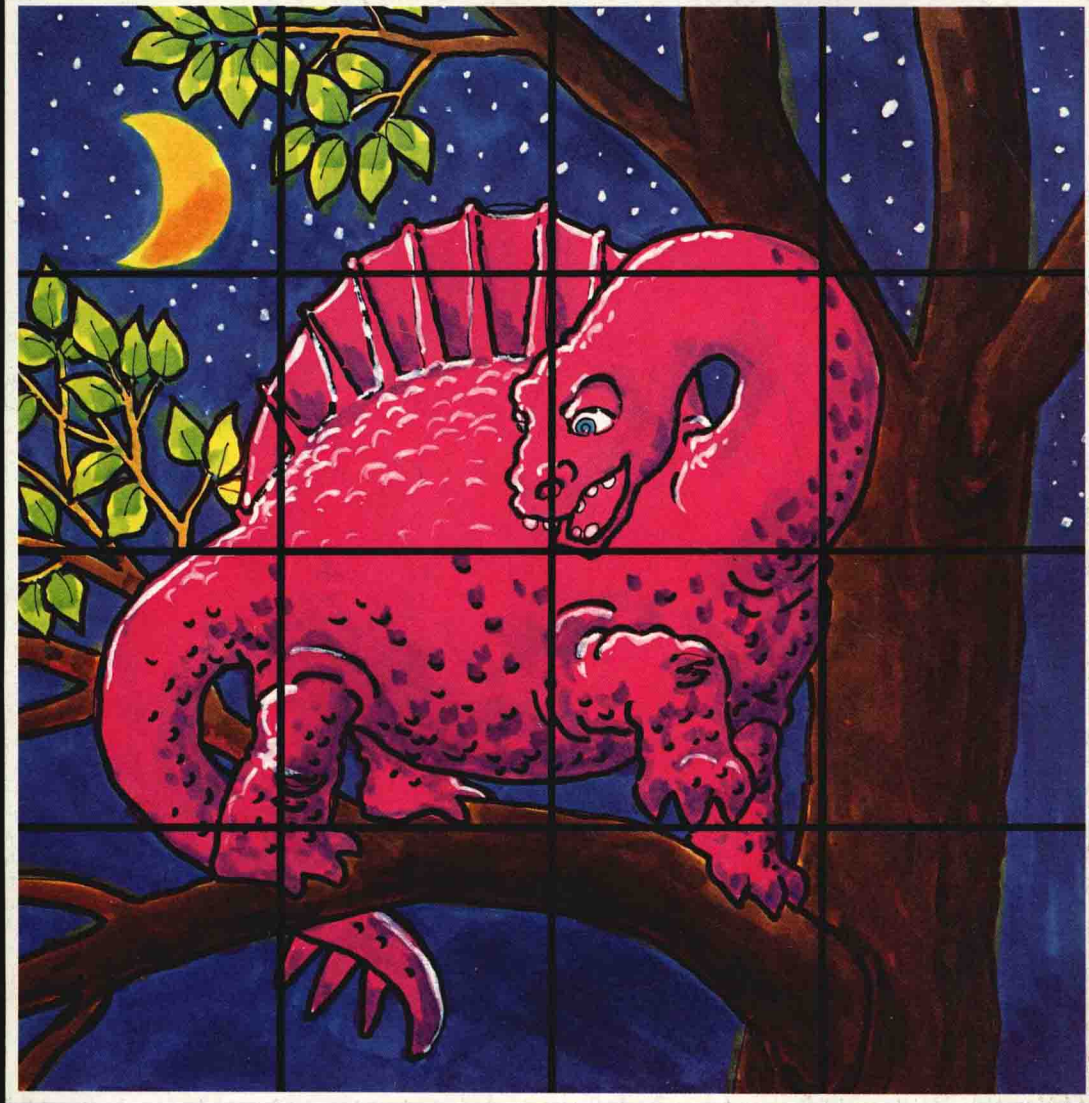




But . . . that silver tiger

a pink dinosaur up in my tree!

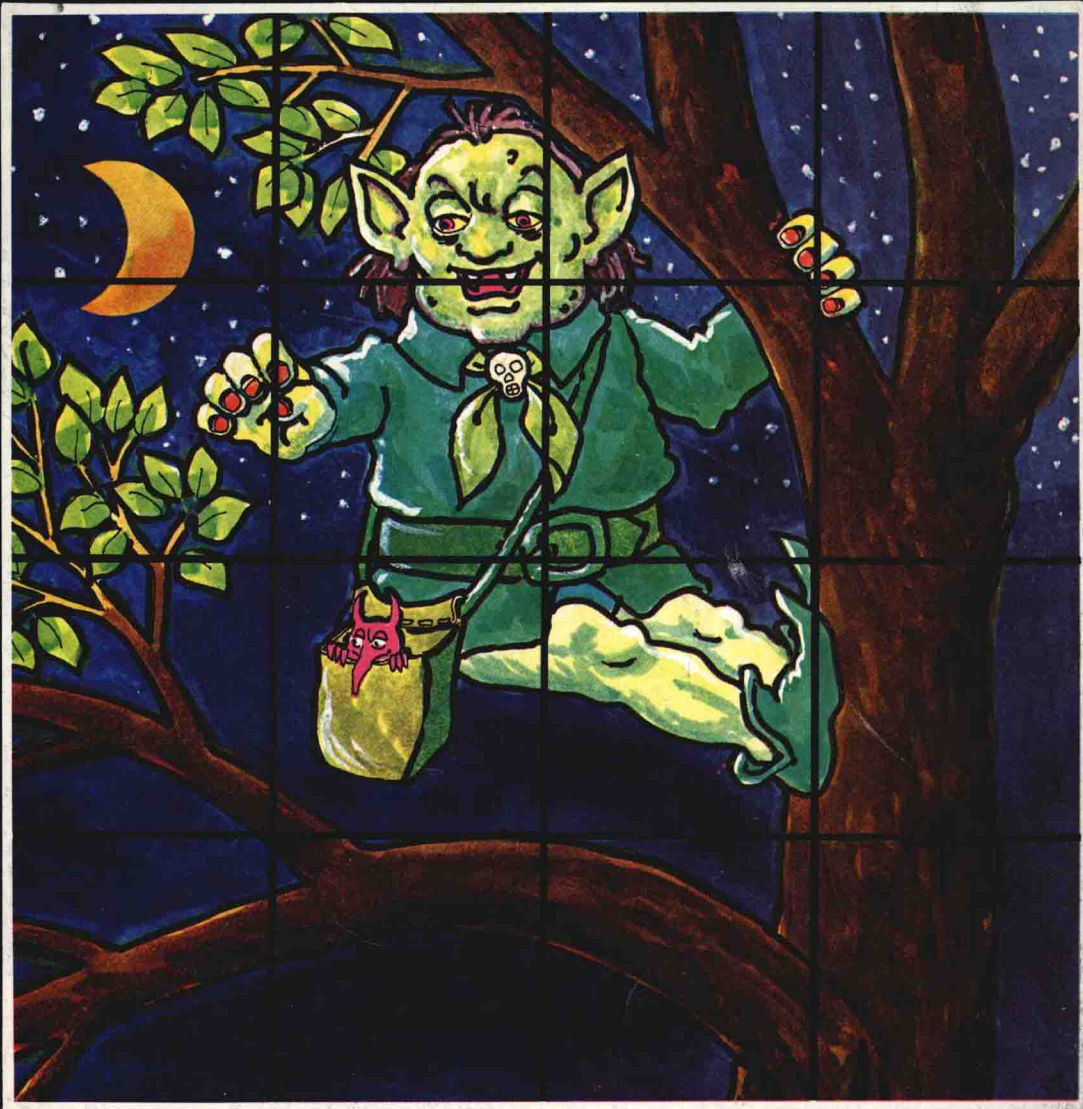




But . . . that pink dinosaur

a green goblin up in my tree!

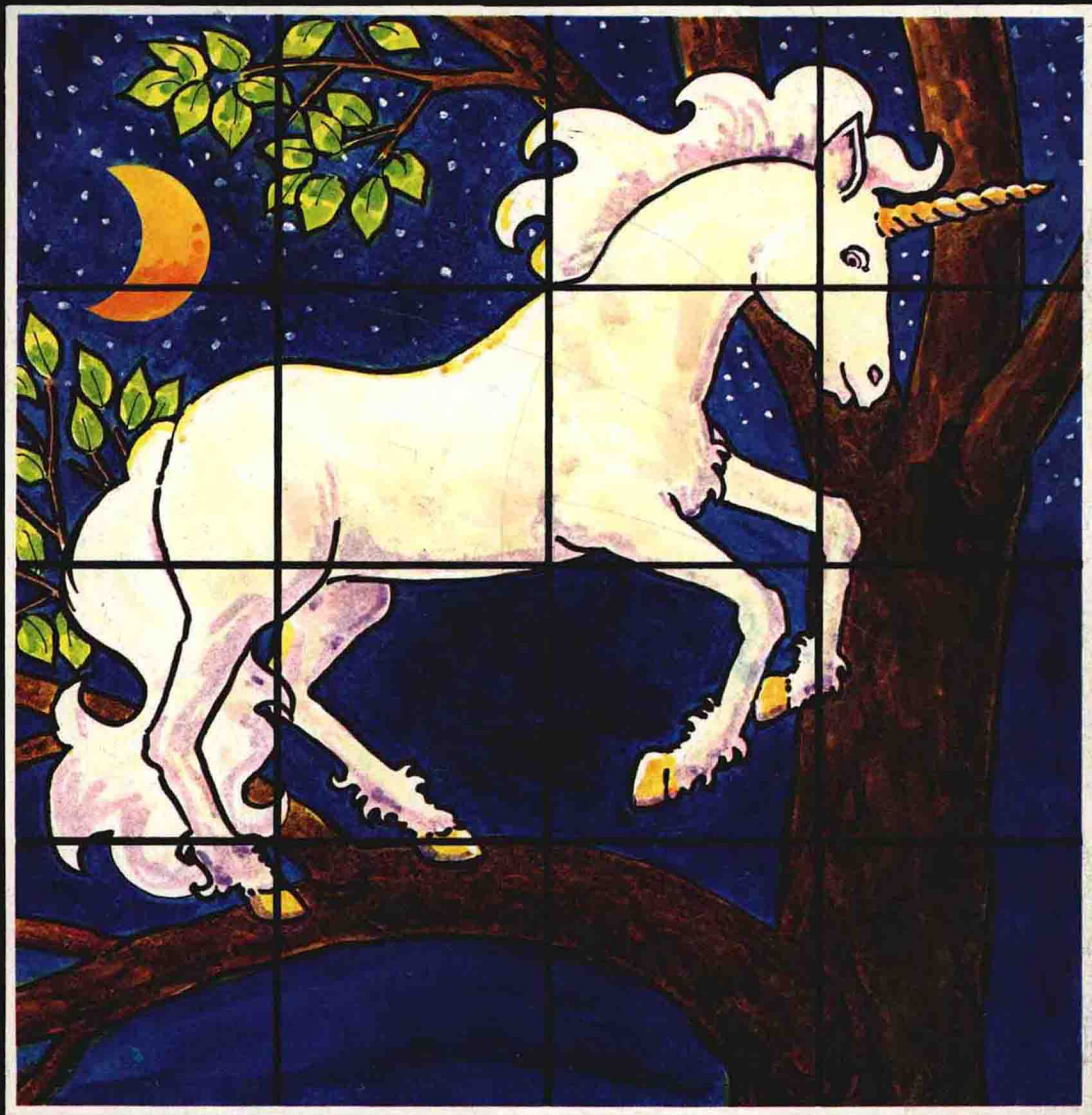




But . . . that green goblin
