

FOREWORD TO THE FIRST EDITION

This Nutshell explores the process by which American judges decide cases. Questions involving both common law adjudication and statutory interpretation are analyzed. Constitutional decision-making and problems concerning the trial of issues are touched upon but lightly; each of those areas requires a book of its own. Although the book has been written with the law student primarily in mind, I hope and believe that it will be of interest and use to others who are interested in the process we use in passing judgment on claims of right.

The author of a book such as this has many persons to thank. My own interest in the subject of this *Nutshell* began in law school in the course in Legal Process. Then Professor (and now Dean) Albert Sacks stimulated us in the classroom and the wonderful materials of that name, prepared by him and the late Professor Henry Hart (discussed further in § 4.2), forced the students to open the windows of their minds.
