#### **Introductory Note**

This, the thirteenth edition of *National Faculty Directory* to be published since the series began in 1970, contains the names, departmental affiliations, and institutional addresses of over 576,300 members of teaching faculties at approximately 3,400 American colleges and universities, and at approximately 145 Canadian institutions using instructional materials primarily in English.

NFD is compiled and maintained from current academic catalogs and course lists. In addition, every person listed in NFD also receives a personal questionnaire at least every 18 months to confirm the accuracy of the name entered in the data base, present affiliation, and current teaching interests.

#### The Scope of This Directory

The coverage of NFD is limited primarily to faculty members with classroom teaching responsibilities.

The data base used for this directory has been maintained for several decades by a service arm of the Association of American University Presses. It is used by university presses and other publishers who need specialized subject-oriented mailing lists for the sale of textbooks and scholarly monographs to members of teaching facilities (and, indirectly, to their students).

Because of the purpose for which the data base is compiled, it does not include faculty members who are not teachers in specific subject areas, and who therefore are not in a position to adopt books for classroom use. Librarians, for example, who often have faculty status, are thus not listed in *NFD* unless they also have teaching assignments.

Since we are aware that *NFD* may well be consulted for affiliations and addresses of librarians and others in a similar status, Gale has attempted to find some way of listing them in *NFD*. It has been found to be impossible, however, for two major reasons: 1) Nonteaching staffs are usually not listed in the course catalogs which are the source documents for maintaining the data base, and 2) If staffs are listed, there is virtually never any indication which staff members have faculty status and which do not. If it becomes possible in the future to include librarians and other nonteaching faculty in *NFD*, Gale will be glad to do so.

#### **Other Omissions**

If a particular school is not covered in this edition of *NFD*, the omission is probably due to nonreceipt of a current catalog by the compilers. Catalogs sent to Gale by omitted schools which wish to be covered will be forwarded promptly. Occasionally, one individual may be omitted while his colleagues are listed, or all members of a given department may be omitted while members of another department are listed. This has often been traceable to data base changes following the refusal, or return to sender, of mail addressed from the data base which was later used for *NFD*.

Gale and the compilers of the directory welcome comments or suggestions at any time.
