L - Linyphium


F - Fabrica

(c. 408 in the East c. 423 in the West)








MAP V

The thick lines show the boundaries between the praetorian prefectures of the East, Illyricum, Italy and Africa. Provinces under the *quaestor exercitus* are marked (Q.E.), those under the praetorian prefect of Africa (A). Sicily (Q) was directly under the *quaestor of the sacred palace*.
