

#### **School Regulations**



#### Sick Leave

The parent of the student must inform the office of the student's absence 5 due to sickness from 7:45 to 8:00 a.m. on any school day. A letter written by the parent and a medical certificate should be submitted to the form teacher on the next school day.

If a student is absent from school due to sickness in the examination period, she must follow the proper procedures for applying for sick leave.

#### I. Present Perfect and Simple Past Tense

#### Top Tip


We use the simple past tense to talk about actions in the past. We may use an adverb or adverbial phrase indicating a finished time such as yesterday, last month, in 1964, etc. to tell people when we did the action.

- e.g. I wrote her a letter last night.

  She left Hong Kong for Japan two months ago.
- 2. We use the present perfect tense to talk about the present result of a past action.
  - e.g. Tim has broken his leg.(past action) He cannot run now. (present result)
    In this sentence, the speaker wants to tell you that Tim broke his leg some time ago and that he cannot run now.
- 3. The present perfect is formed by have / has + the past participle of the verb.
