Preface

This coursebook aims at introducing the law student, and the upper-division undergraduate student, to the law of foreign relations. For too long, that body of law has received little curricular attention. Courses in constitutional, criminal, and international law have touched upon various aspects, but largely in a hit-and-miss fashion. Perhaps because teaching materials have been unavailable, few educational institutions have offered a course on foreign relations law as such.

The subject of this course is the interaction between the conduct of United States foreign relations and the constitutional distribution of powers, prerogatives and rights within the nation. That distribution—between the President and his officers, the Congress, the states and the people—is broadly outlined by the Constitution and, to an extent, by the courts. It is clear that the constitutional “entitlements” of these four actors—repositories of rights and duties—do overlap. This overlap has been acknowledged and also mitigated, in practice, by the conduct of parties to actual disputes. Where such accommodation has been elusive, the courts sometimes have invented rules of adjustment. At other times, priorities have been accorded the rights of one or another actor by institutional practice, political maneuvering, or litigation. There are also broad areas where no accommodation has been reached, where courts have refused to intervene, and where the struggle continues unresolved and, in some instances, unguided by applicable norms of legitimacy.

The preceding is also true of the distribution of power as it pertains to domestic governance. The foreign relations power is different, however, from such areas of interaction as the regulation of commerce. While not recognized as a discrete function by the Constitution, the foreign relations power has nevertheless been accorded a special status in the political and judicial arenas because, it is said, all else depends upon the survival of the Republic. From this it would seem to follow that the system of checks and balances applicable to the system of domestic power may not apply in the foreign relations field because it would encumber the nation’s ability to defend that precious but precarious system. That assertion, often made as if self-evident, is hotly rejected by those who think it irrational and immoral to bend the rules in order to preserve them.

The issues involved are enormous—perhaps the most monumental that any lawyer ever confronts: When can the President introduce the armed forces into hostilities without congressional authorization? Are congressional efforts to control their use constitutional? How far can the President, acting alone, commit the United States internationally?

To what extent can individual rights—such as freedom of the press and freedom from otherwise illegal searches or seizures—constitutionally be constricted for reasons of “national security”? What role can the courts properly play in adjudicating such disputes? May the President “faithfully execute” the law of nations? Can property of a United States citizen be taken without compensation to carry out a diplomatic initiative?

These questions have been hotly debated, of course, since the earliest days of the Republic, and many contemporary arguments are but replays of previous disputes. Consequently, materials once written on parchment retain an enduring relevance. As the Nation moves into its third century, however, with parchment replaced by floppy discs, old controversies take on new forms. Unprecedented threats are posed, not only to the nation but also to values at the heart of our legal structure. These materials provide students an opportunity to confront these difficult choices of law, policy, and social values in both an historical and contemporary context.

In ten years of teaching this course (or seminar), we have found the simulation technique most effective. A course employing that approach can be simply structured. The casebook contains 13 simulations. Within the first week or two, students “sign on” to simulated roles which require research both within, but also beyond, the four corners of this volume. While the students prepare for their roles, an “introductory” phase of the course should occur, during which the instructor may acquaint the class with certain of the recurrent issues that constitute the unifying threads of this subject: exclusive versus concurrent institutional exercise of power, the comparative credence to be given to competing sources of constitutional authority (constitutional text and structure, intent of the Framers, historical precedent, judicial extrapolation), relative institutional capacity to engage in activities touching on foreign relations (functional analysis). The aim is to raise to a level of generalized, principled, and enunciated normativity the arguments that students will be making in the course of the practice-oriented, workaday roles they are to perform in the various simulations. This conceptual “vocabulary” is outlined in the first chapter.

As noted above, the main body of the course consists of these simulations. Unlike traditional casebook “problems,” the simulations assign students specific roles with client-oriented objectives. They pose practical problems in “real-life” contexts and students are given the bulk of the tools they will need to use. As nearly as possible in the classroom setting, they are challenged to perform as real lawyers.

Except for chapter one, where the recurrent themes of the course are outlined, this book is organized around such simulations, with one or several per chapter. The materials surrounding each simulation are designed to illuminate all sides of the matter at issue. Students might suppose that an assistant has gathered materials of *prima facie* relevance; it is for the student to fit those materials together into a
