前 言

高校英语专业四级考试(TEM4)的目的是全面检查已学完英语专业四级(每学期为一级)课程的学生是否达到教学大纲所规定的各项要求,考核学生运用各项基本技能的能力以及学生对语法结构和词语用法的掌握程度,既测试学生的综合能力,也测试学生的单项技能。同时,也是评估教学质量,推动校际交流学习的一种手段。

TEM4 已进行 10 多年了。这期间考试题型、试题数量和时间安排经历了几次变化,从 1996 年起才固定为现在的模式。为了使学生全面了解和熟悉 TEM4,我们将 1992 年至 2001 年的试题进行了解析。除了已不考的题型外,基本保持试卷的原貌,但是分题型进行解析。本书适合准备参加高校英语专业四级考试的学生使用,也适合准备参加大学英语六级考试、硕士学位研究生考试、TOEFL、EPT、PETS 四级和五级考试的考生及广大自学英语者复习、自测时使用。

由于水平有限,不当之处在所难免,恳请读者在使用过程中提出批评指正。
