

【内容输要】 本书旨在为四级英语考生应考前提供一本针对性极强的词 汇习额集、使考生的词汇量在考前有较大的增长与巩固。本书采用词频理论和实 验方法从大学英语教学大纲 4000 词中洗出 1000 个较难单调和 200 个常用的词 组并以此编写成习题集。全书共分24 单元。每个单元50 题、书末附有重点单词 注解及答案和三套词汇测试题。由于本书选词均是有一定难度的常用词。故本书 亦适用于其他类型考生。

#### 第2版前言

《大学英语四级应试系列丛书》1996年一经推出,就受到广大读者的欢迎,前后多次重印,仍供不应求,各地书店和读者纷纷求购。为满足广大读者的要求,我社根据国家教委《大学英语教学大纲》规定的要求和全国大学英语四、六级考试委员会公布的最新题型,进行了全面修订,以飨读者。

#### 前 言

词汇学习与积累是英语学习中极为重要的组成部分。根据调查,目前绝大部分四级考试应试考生对大纲词汇表所指定的单词仍有 700~1 000 个不熟悉或不认识。词汇量偏小是造成考生应考失败的重要原因之一。本书的编写旨在为考生提供一本针对性极强的练习材料,使考生对一些较难单词有熟悉、巩固的机会,同时使考生的词汇量在较短的时间内有较大的增长。

本书是根据词频理论对大学英语教学大纲中(理工科)的 4 000 个单词进行筛选,并用实验进行验证,最后再根据多位 教师的教学经验作适当的调整,选出 1 200 个对大学二年级学生具有一定难度且对阅读会造成障碍的单词与词组。并以此编写成练习,供四级应考者作考前训练使用。

本书每50题编为一个单元,共24单元。全书分为四个部分。第一部分从Test 1~Test 7,主要以熟练巩固为主,兼顾扩大词汇量(该部分由350个单词组成)。其中句子和选择项所用单词控制在四级词汇范围内。第二部分从Test 8~Test 16,主要以扩大词汇量为主(该部分由450个单词组成)。其中句子所用单词亦控制在四级词汇范围内,而在选择项中增加了部分在阅读中极为常见,且被列入原大纲六级词汇表的单词。第三部分从Test17~Test20(该部分由200个单词组成)。其中所选单词均是最新版大纲词汇表所新增单词。第四部分

从 Test21~Test24(该部分由 200 个词组组成)。第四部分所选 200 个词组亦是新版大纲词汇表所指定的词组。在本书第三、四部分中,所有选择项均为大纲指定词汇,但为了增加句子难度和提高考生对词汇的辨识能力,这两部分句子中有少量超纲词汇。同时,为了使考生有较多机会接触、复习大纲词汇表中较难单词,本书选择项中专门安排重点单词和较难单词多处复现,以利于考生巩固。

本书所选用单词义项均属大纲指定义项范围。同时,书末附有重点单词的简略注释。

本书可作为大学英语四级考试考生的考前强化训练材料。由于本书所选单词均是具有一定难度的常用词,故本书亦适用于其他类型考生。

本书主要修订内容有:邀请美国语言学家 Andrew T. Wolen 对全书进行了审校,修正了原书中的不妥之处,另外增加了三套词汇量测试题,以便读者自测。

本书由西安张梅娟、闫传海编著。全书所有词汇练习均由 编著者专门为本书编写设计。限于作者水平,错误在所难免,敬 请读者指正。
