

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前 言

语音、词汇、语法是语言的三大要素。一个人英语水平的高低,在很大程度上取决于其词汇量的大小和语法结构的熟练程度。词汇和语法(简称词语)是听、读、说、写的基础。因此,全国大学英语四、六级统考把 Vocabulary and Structure 作为单独一项来考,以引起教学双方的重视,看来是不无道理的。

扩大英语词汇量不外有两种方法:直接法和间接法。直接 法就是孤立地或通过上下文自觉地掌握词汇,例如背词典,背 词汇表,做各种词汇练习,研究构词法,等等。间接法就是通过 大量的读、听实践,不知不觉地掌握词汇。有人实验证明,直接 法掌握一个词汇需要重复7次,而间接法需要重复16次。因 此,学习英语应以大量的听、读、说、写实践为主,辅之以学点 构词知识,做些词汇练习,背些词汇表等。

本题集是根据《大学英语文、理科教学大纲词汇表》公布的五六级 1300 个词汇编辑而成的词语练习集。可供参加六级统考的本科生或研究生使用。通过测试形式,一则可以测试您的现有水平,二则可以帮助您掌握未知的词语。多选题形式的好处,在于让您在同义、近似、易混的语言环境中区别正误,从而牢固地掌握词语。本题集部分取自我室张华教授所建立的计算机大学英语六级试题库,全集共分 50 个 Tests,每个 Test 含 20 道题,便于当堂测试、判分、讲评。做错之题,最好以红笔圈其题号,以便彻底研究及日后复习。

由于水平有限,仓猝成册,谬误之处谨请读者诸君斧正。
