编写说明

《英汉双解词典》共收词 18000 条,短语和习惯用语 15000 余条,同时有的相应词条还增加了派生词和复合词。本词典不同一般的英汉词典,它具有英汉双解的功能,它不仅可让使用者正确理解每个单词和词组的含义,同时又能准确地让使用者恰到好处的运用这些词汇和短语。为了方便学生使用,我们把凡属大学、中学英语教学大纲中要求掌握的词汇和短词逐条逐项给以了英语解释和例证。本词典具有词条、项目规范、准确、简明实用,是学生不可缺少的工具书,本词典可供研究生、大学生、中学生、英语教师及广大英语爱好者使用。

由于编写者的水平有限,加之时间仓促,词典中难免有些缺点和错误,敬请广大读者批评指正。
