## 第一章 结构与词汇

## 一 语法部分(180题)

在学习英语的过程中,牢固掌握基本的,较为系统的语法知识,树立正确的语法观念,这对于提高听说读写四项基本技能的无论哪个方面的能力都是最根本的。做好语法填空题,首先应熟练掌握教学大纲规定的语法部分的测试范围和具体项目,综合概括为:名词;限定词;代词;动词的语态和时态(情态动词,虚拟语气,被动语态,不定式,分词);定语从句,状语从句(时间,原因,目的,结果,方式,条件,让步),名词性从句;直接(间接)引语,并列(从属)结构;形容词和副词的比较级,最高级,介词和介词词组,主谓一致,倒装,省略,附加疑问句,存在句等等。但具体到如何答题上,则先要确定该题属于何种语法结构类型,属于哪种具体语法现象,针对不同情况采取不同的解题思路和技巧。根据往年的考题,现将语法项目的则试重点归结如下:

- [1] 动词时态:应注意时间状语,动作的前后顺序,以及一些特殊句型。
- [2] 虚拟语气:注意虚拟条件句的三种基本情况,表示愿望,建议,命令的动词或形容词,以及可能引起虚拟的其他词语和形式。
- [3] 并列句和复合句:定语从句,主语从句,同位语从句,以及 whoever / whatever 等连接词的用法。
  - [4] 非谓语动词:不定式,动名词和某些动词的固定搭配。
  - [5] 语序倒装: 部分和全部倒装, 虚拟语气以及某些状语从句中的倒装。
  - [6] 强调句型。
  - [7] 否定形式的多样性:部分否定,绝对,双重否定和半否定。
  - [8] 省略。

考生在做语法题时,应全面运用多项语法规则,结合语义判断,兼顾人称,数,时态,语态,惯用法等诸多因素,从形式到内容进行综合逻辑分析判断。
