内 容 简 介

本书是为准备应考研究生用的英语练习集，内容包括语法、翻译、综合运用、阅读理解等部分，以练习的形式编排。书中英语资料取自国外书刊。本书是参照硕士学位研究生入学考试英语试卷的要求，并针对我国学生的特点及困难编选而成的。这些练习不仅有助于复习并补充语法知识，而且有利于扩充词汇和广泛地掌握语言现象，提高实际运用语言的能力。全部练习均有答案以资查对。书后附有近几年的硕士学位研究生入学考试英语试卷及答案，并根据答卷中的典型错误做了注释及例解。

本书可供文理各科应考生参考，也可供高等院校学生及自学英语人员参考。

前 言

(Foreword)

近三年来，为辅导我校学生准备研究生考试，我们选编了大量练习，旨在通过实际操练使学生系统地复习并扩充一些语法知识和语言现象，提高语言活用能力。根据几年来试用情况及考生反映，这些资料基本合适。现根据读者要求，将它们再次精选、增补、汇集出版。

作为一本练习集，篇幅有限，很难做到兼收并蓄，应有尽有。我们只能力求从教学实际出发，针对学生的实际情况，尽量做到内容全面、形式多样，以使它具有较大的实用价值，真正有益于英语学习过程中的总结与提高。

书中材料均选自近年来的英美书刊、试题和练习集。汉译英部分已由美籍教师 M. Kelly 先生阅审。选材兼顾文理科的需要与词汇的常用性，尽可能反映各种句型及惯用法。语法练习按词类编排，连词因主要涉及句法，未单独列出。各部分中题目的排列，则根据各自特点，主要从使用方便考虑。翻译练习中的英汉语译文主要采用直译，以利于进行对比。

为了便于读者了解考试的实际情况，我们将几年来的研究生试卷及参考答案附于书后，并将其中识别正错题中的错误改正后放在该题的参考答案里。同时，针对考生试卷中汉译英部分的典型错误，编写了识别正误的练习，作为第五单元的练习一。此外，在每篇英译汉短文之后，还加了必要的注释。

关于本书的使用问题，鉴于上述编排意图，建议读者按照顺序，依次把题目做完。书后附有全部答案，但应将练习做完后再查对。

参加本书编选工作的有（按编写的单元次序排列）：吴世珍、杨同福、耿宪章、邢志春、刘牟尼、文涛六位同志。全书由耿宪章同志审阅。

这次再版，除加附84年硕士学位研究生试题及答案外，还增补了一些词语搭配方面的练习。这是根据对1984年考卷的分析并考虑到词汇的掌握对进一步提高英语水平有关键性作用而编排的。在选材中，我们着眼于以名、形、动等词类为中心的习语与固定搭配，尽量撷取常见多用但易混难解的语言现象。希望这些不同形式的练习有助于读者更广泛地熟悉英语中丰富多采而又至关重要的成语及惯用法，从而提高对英语的理解和运用能力。

由于篇幅所限，还有一部分本该补充的材料此次未能收入，望读者见谅。
