

【内容简介】 本书是在仔细研究并且参照了大学英语教学大纲以及近年来大学英语六级考试中词汇题的基础上编写而成的,目的在于为六级英语考生提供一本较为全面的,具有指导性的词汇练习题集。

本书从大学英语教学大纲所列出的要求 5~6 级学生掌握的单词和调组中, 挑选出 950 个见题率高并且难度大的单词和 50 条在意思和用法上极易混淆的 词组,悉心编排成综合性的词汇练习题集。

全书共有1000 题,分20个单元,每单元50 题。练习题后附有难点单词注释及参考答案。

由于本书收入的均为难度较大的高级词汇,故它也适用于英语六级以外的其他类型考生。

前言

近年来,通过大学英语四级考试的学生人数不断增加,其中又有不少人希望能够一鼓作气,再通过六级考试。而在英语考试中,最使考生普遍感到无所适从的就是词汇方面的题。学生在平时的学习过程中,遇到问题最多的也是词汇方面的——同义词、近义词的辨义;介词短语和动词短语的搭配和正确使用,以及英语一词多词性的特点。从大纲词汇表来看,有相当一部分的六级词汇对刚刚通过四级考试的学生来说还是很生解或没有完全掌握的。

本书针对考生在准备六级考试词汇时面临的这些具体情况,在仔细研究了近年来六级词汇考题的基础上,对大学英语教学大纲中要求掌握的单词和词组进行认真筛选,挑出1000个难度大且会影响阅读理解的单词和词组,以习题的形式编写成书,以供六级考生练习使用。本书能使考生在较短时间内迅速扩大词汇量,并且熟悉和掌握一些较难单词。

本书共选编了 1 000 道词汇练习题,每 50 题构成一个单元,全书共有 20 个单元。书末附有重点单词注释及参考答案。

由于编者水平有限,书中必有不妥之处,敬请广大读者和 同行批评指教。
