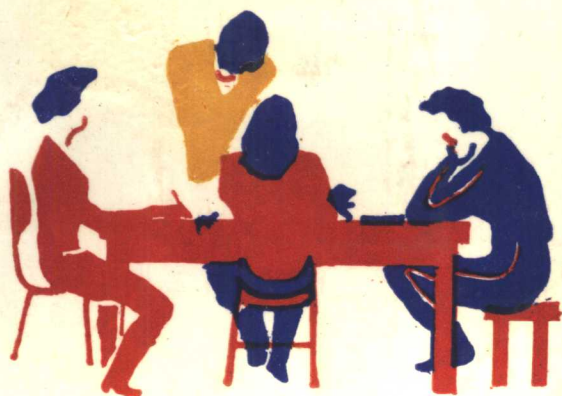

## 内 容 简 介

本书系配合《大学英语分级系列试题 (1-4 级)》(GCET) 一书编写的。内容包括听力理解部分的原文、全部问题的参考答案(包括参考作文)和疑难问题注释与分析三部分。后一部分对 GCET 一书中的疑难问题作了较详细的注释和分析,并对某些语言现象加以引申、归纳和总结,便于读者复习巩固已学过的语言知识、扩大词汇、掌握各种搭配和常用词的辩异,进而提高英语水平和应试能力。

本书的听力理解部分配有由外籍英语专家录制的录音磁带 10 盘。

本书适合各类高等院校的大学英语 1-4 级分级教学和考试使用,是准备省市三级和全国四级英语统考者的良师益友,并可供报考研究生和 TOEFL (托福) 等各类考试的考生及英语自学者参考。

## 前 言

《大学英语分级系列试题（1—4级）——听力原文·答案·注释·分析》是配合《大学英语分级系列试题（1—4级）》（Graded College English Tests 简称 GCET）编写的，本书内容包括 GCET 中各试题的听力材料原文、全部问题的参考答案（包括参考作文）和疑难问题注释与分析三部分。第 I 部分为听力理解试题的原文和注释。该部分配有由外籍英语专家 Alice Davidson 和 Daniel Keranen 等录制的录音磁带 10 盘，经使用受到学生的欢迎；第 II 部分给出了 GCET 中全部问题的答案；第 III 部分对 GCET 中的疑难问题作了注释和分析，并对某些语言现象和难点加以引申、归纳和总结。以便于读者复习和巩固已学的语言知识、扩大词汇、掌握各种搭配和各种语言现象，进而提高英语水平和应试能力。

本书既适合各类高等院校大学英语（1—4 级）的分级教学和考试使用，也适于准备省市三级和全国四级英语统考的读者阅读，并可供准备报考研究生和 TOEFL 等考试的考生及英语自学者参考。

本书由魏旭光负责听力理解原文的选编和注释，给出全书的参考答案（包括参考作文）和四级模拟试题 1、2 以及 1990 年 1 月全国大学英语考试正式试题中的疑难问题注释；孟宪昌负责分级试题 1—16 和四级样题中的疑难问题注释；姜明负责分级试题 17—32 中阅读理解部分的注释；胡巧莲负责分级试题 17—32 中词汇与结构部分的注释；姜汉伯负责分级试题 17—32 中的完形填空部分和四级模拟试题 3 中的疑难问题注释。最后，由魏旭光统筹整理与补充，姜明誊写，孟宪昌、魏旭光负责

复核与修订。

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## Part I

### Listening Comprehension Scripts with Key Answers for GCET

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The following is the tapescript for the Listening Comprehension section for each of the tests included in the GCET book. Note that the Listening Comprehension sections always appear as Section I of the tests. Each Listening Comprehension section in each test has two parts and each of these parts has separate instructions.

When you take the model test in the GCET book as a preliminary step in your preparation for actual examination, you should use the tapes that accompany the GCET book. Try to get the tapes. If you do not have the tapes, you can find the corresponding tapescript in this book and have someone read the script to you. Be sure that they understand the timing sequences. The reader should work with a stop watch or with a regular watch with a second hand so that he or she can keep careful track of the timed pauses between questions. Be sure that the speaker speaks clearly and at a moderately paced rate. For results that would be closest to the actual situation, it is recommended that two or three persons be asked to read, since some of the Listening Comprehension sections utilize dialogues.
