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前言

为了进一步改进全国大学英语四级考试,提高其实用性和效率,增强学生实际运用英语的能力,经原国家教育委员会高等教育司批准,全国大学英语考试委员会决定增加新的题型,并从1996年的全国大学英语四级考试开始采用之。每次考试具体题型,将在原有题型和新增题型中产生。这些题型是:听力理解、听写填空、词汇与结构、阅读理解、简答、翻译、写作、完形填空等。

本书是按照国家教育部1999年主持编写的大学英语教学大纲和考试大纲,以及新编的大学英语四级词汇表,由富有多年大学英语教学经验的教师和专家编写的。为了帮助考生及时适应考试题型的变化以及顺利通过考试,本书测试题全部按照新题型编排,在内容和形式上都与国家大学英语四级考试保持一致,使读者能够得到身临其境的锻炼。

本书精选的10套试题难度适当,选材面广,代表性强,多次应用于四级考前培训,效果显著;从教学效果来看,对于提高学生英语水平,提高四级通过率也都起到了良好的作用。
