前 喜

在英语交际中,听和说的能力是极其重要的方面。听和说的能力相辅相成,互为一体。只有听得好,才能说得流利;而通过说,又可以增强对语言的感性认识,从而活跃思维,促进听的能力的提高。多年的教学实践使我们亲身体会到边听边说、听说结合的综合训练和实践有助于提高英语学习者加强综合训能力。这本《英语听说训练》就是专为英语学习者加强综合训练而编写的。

本书按《大学英语教学大纲》中 1—6 级对听、说能力的要求编写,着重训练英语听、说能力,适合大学生、高级中学学生及英语爱好者自我练习,也可供教师作英语听说课堂训练补充教材之用。全书共十课,每课由三部分组成:1. 热身练习;2.情景对话;3. 短文。各部分均遵循边听边说、听说结合的原则,配有多种形式的练习(Questions and Answers; Identification; Listening In; Talking It Over; Focusing In; Filling In; Summing Up; Retelling; Speaking Out),使学习者在完成相应练习的过程中理解所听内容和情景,分析消化,并举一反三,使之转化为自身语言表达的源泉。各课的情景对话和短文练习中均列出关键词汇的词语解释,书后附有练习参考答案和音带的书面材料,便于学习者自练、自查。

本书附音带 2 盒,注重语言选编材料的真实性。全部有声资料选自英、美等国的有关听力材料,包括不同年龄、性别之间的对话和说白(个别之处因口语之故,在语言习惯上可能与

我国有些不同),内容新颖多样,富有生活情趣,且由浅入深、易于上口。
