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# 前 言

为了迎接 21 世纪的挑战,使大学英语教学再上一个新台阶,以适应国民经济和社会发展的需要,适应高等教育深化改革、培养跨世纪人才的需要,高等学校本科用《大学英语教学大纲》(修订本)于1999 年 5 月颁布实行。该大纲对学生读、听、说、写、译等能力的要求都有了明显的、较大幅度的提高,对听的能力比以前也有了更高的要求。如,对基础阶段的较高要求(即五级~六级)是"对题材熟悉、句子结构不太复杂、基本上没有生词、语速为每分钟 150 词~170 词的篇幅较长的会话、谈话、报道和讲座,掌握其中心大意,抓住要点和有关细节,领会讲话者的观点和态度,并能进行分析推理和判断"。因而,在修习完基础阶段六级后,学生应该具有一定的听的能力,对题材熟悉、难度略低于精读课文、基本上没有生词、语速每分钟 140 词的听力材料,要求一遍能够听懂,并且理解的准确率不低于 70%。

历年统考情况表明,听力理解部分一直是学生的薄弱环节,学生在基础语音(辨音、重音、连续和语调等方面的)训练、基础词汇辨识、惯用表达法的掌握以及逻辑思维、有效记忆和语言的总体敏感性等诸多方面均存不同程度的不足。在这些方面,与教学和测试密切相关的听力理解辅导材料不多,高质量的、规范的录音磁带更是少见。为了有助于同学们养成正确的听音习惯和提高听力理解的基本技能,并帮助同学们平时练习和突破应试难关,我们编写了《大学英语六级听力理解考试模拟试题集》这本书。

本书包括大学英语六级国家统一考试听力理解部分的全部题型,即对话(Conversation)、短文(Passages)和复合式听写(Compound Dictation)。本书共有 10 套模拟试题,每套试题均由上述三种题型组成,而国家考试只择其中两种题型,而且每次统考前不公布其所测试的题型。本书每套试题均包括所有题型的目的是突出其实用性,使同学们做全面和充分的准备,以取得理想的成绩。

本书选材力求广泛、新颖,既汪重尖用性和针对性,也兼顾到知识性和趣味性,从而提高同学们的学习兴趣和练习效果。

本书录音磁带严格按照教学大纲要求精心录制,由美籍专家朗读,语音纯正,朗读规范,语速标准(前5套试题语速每分钟140词,后5套试题每分钟150词)。

本书最后附录 1999 年 6 月、2000 年 1 月、2001 年 6 月和 2002 年 1 月四份国家六级考试听力理解考试部分的真题和答案供同学们练习与参考。

教学法与测试学的研究永无止境,由于编者缺乏经验,书中疏漏、不妥之处实为难免,我们诚恳地希望读者多加批评指正,从使此书渐臻完善。
