略。写法深入浅出，力求生动引人。

Five Thousand Years of Shaanxi vividly presents to the curious reader the history of Shaanxi Province from the legendary Emperor Huang Di to the contemporary socialist construction, focusing on peoples and events in the way of an historical record. The book places Shaanxi at the centre stage of the history of ancient and modern China and recording the ups and downs of the historical cha-

Chang'an was the capital city of China for over a span of a thousand years. Politically Shaanxi is the cradle of people's revolutions of which, the thirteen-year Yan'an Revolution contributed to the birth of New China.

Historical remains, almost without number, attract thousands and thousands of people from all over the world. These remains and the beautiful locales of their discoveries are scattered throughout the province like stars in the firmament. The Qin terra-cotta warriors, and the horses and bronze chariots leave guests and tourists breathless. The remains of the Famen Temple underground palace are also felt to be a required experience for the Chinese and foreigners alike.

"You haven't seen China if you haven't seen

Xi'an," is the general consensus expressed by all the tourists coming to Shaanxi.

The book presents to the readers the famous features and important events of Shaanxi's history. It is arranged chronologically and is divided into eight parts with 462 chapters. The whole book is 62,000-word long. In some chapters, one person or one event are described, while in others chapters there may be several persons or events. Usually each chapter has about a thousands words. A few of them may have several thousands words. The source material for the book is predominantly drawn from biographical records, local records or files of vital statistics. The latest archaeological and the most recent historical research achievements also contribute greatly to the fascinating web of history that has been woven. The profound theory is explained in simple terms. The descriptions are accurate, colourful and to the point. With its rich variety the book reveals an historical outline of Shaanxi for over five thousand years. Academic research and knowledge give authenticity to the book. Having all the features above, the book is therefore appear to extremely readable and interesting.
