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内容简介

本书是根据国家教委制定的硕士研究生人学英语考试新大纲编写,供考生考前强化训练使用。内容覆盖本科英语语法和词汇知识要点。全书由两部分组成:第一部分包括词汇与语法、阅读、填空、改错、翻译和写作等六种类型的单项试题;第二部分为三份完整的模拟试卷。 另附 1991年和 1992年的人学试卷。各部分均有参考答案。本书对将要参加大学英语四、六级考试的考生也很有参考价值。

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《硕士研究生入学英语试题集》是以国家教委新制定的全国硕士研究生入学考试《英语考试大纲》为依据,参照1991年和1992年硕士生入学试卷的形式与内容编写的。

在编写过程中,广泛研究了国内外同类试题,参考了本校多年来积累的素材。全书内容覆盖本科英语语法和词汇知识要点,含有应掌握的主要语言技能的训练,充分体现了研究生入学考试试题的要求和特点,具有较强的针对性和实用性。

本书分为两大部分。第一部分是分类试题,包括词汇与语法结构、阅读理解、完形填空、辩错与改错、英译汉和短文写作等六种不同类型的单项试题,每项含有六至十个单元,每单元的题型、题量和难易度均与实际试卷中的对应题项相同。第二部分由三份完整的模拟试卷组成,另附 1991 年和1992年入学试卷。各部分都有参考答案。读者通过模拟题的练习,既可对所掌握的语言知识和技能进行自我评估、对存在的问题进行自我诊断,又可以较全面地复习所学语言知识要点、训练和巩固运用语言的技能,从而提高应试能力,考出好的成绩。本书对准备参加大学英语四、六级考试的考生也很有参考价值。
