### 编写说明

《新编英语口语教程》原系厦门大学外文系 英语 专业一、二年级口语课教材。全套书共四册,经过试用和修改,现出版第三册,供高等院校英语专业二年级上学期试用,也可满足中、高级口语培训班和一般要求提高英语口语的读者的需要。

第三册编写的指导思想和选材原则与第一、二册相同。 编写时参照高校英语专业基础阶段数学大纲的精神,注意吸 收八十年代国内外视听说教材的长处以及我国学生的实际需 要。为了充分利用现有的各种先进教学媒体,合理地、有机 地把它们结合起来并运用到口语教学中,我们 采 用 了 视、 听、说相结合的编法。编写时注意口语教材与视听教材相辅 相成又相互有别的特点,突出口头表达能力的训练和培养。

第三册的题材和体例安排以及训练的重点等方面与第一、二册有较大的不同。题材由学生熟悉的学校生活转向社交场合和社会生活。进一步加强交际能力和连贯性发言能力的训练和培养。体例安排方面也做了相应的变动。第三册共十课,每课包括七个项目。为了帮助教师和学生更好地使用本书,以下简略介绍一下这七个项目及其设计意图。

第一项: 开头活跃气氛问答题(Opening Warm-up Question)。这一项是每课的引子,以口头问答的形式启发学生说出每课的主题。

第二项: 对话课文(Understanding Dialogue)。

这一项是每课的主体,包括三个与每课题材相关的对话。每个对话配有听录音、填空、回答问题、句型操练、情景对话或小组讨论等五个单项练习。课文仍然采用填空的形式。课文全文配有录音(书上标有 OO的标号)。

第三项:故事复述(Retelling)。这一项是第一、二册没有的新项目。为了培养学生连贯性的发言能力,我们每课精选了一个与课文题材十分相近的小故事或短文,供同学做听说练习。学生先听录音,同时把留空的字句填上,然后再复述故事。这部分的全文也配有录音(书上标有[OO]的符号)。

第四项:录相节目(Video-programme)。每课的录相节目约五到十分钟。课本里只有问答题,文字材料在附录部分。老师可根据学生的实际水平进行问答或复述等视听说综合练习。

第五项:文化背景知识(Cultural Comments)。这一项是为了帮助学生正确运用语言而增设的。因为,第三册的题材以社交场合和社会生活为主,学生一般不熟悉这方面的题材,教师可在课堂内简单介绍,亦可让学生自学。

第六项:词汇和短语注释(Notes)。在这一项 里,我们已将每课从第一项到第五项中出现的生词 和短语列了出来并加上了中(英)文的注释,目的是 为了减少学生查词典的时间,让学生把更多的时间 用在听录音和开口练习说话上面。为了方便读者查 阅,我们在附有注释的词或短语上都标上了数目字。

第七项:英语歌曲(English Songs)。第三册仍 采用每课一歌的作法。除书上附有歌曲的词和谱以 外,歌曲的录音也录在教学录音带里。

每课的内容按四个课时设计。大体上可以这样安排:一个对话(包括五个单项训练)一个课时,三个对话三个课时,故事复述和录相节目一个课时。每一个对话及所配的五个单项练习是独立成章的,教师可根据学生的实际情况在教学时采用其中的一至二个或全部的对话内容。

为了教学和自学方便,第三册仍配有录音带和录相带。教学录音带包括每课的对话课文和故事复述部分(在课本里注有 |○○| 的符号),录相节目的录音和英语歌曲等项内容。第三册的附录部分有三个内容:1。常用会话句型。2.一些中国名胜古跡的英文材料。3.录音和录相的文字材料。

编写多媒体口语教材是口语教学方面的一种尝试,由于 编者水平十分有限,错漏一定难免。敬请使用本教材的教师 和同学予以指正。

本书编写过程得到厦大外文系领导和外语电教室朱居顺同志的热情关心和支持,美籍专家Dr Ross Chen 为本书审阅了全稿,在此谨致谢意。

本册书由林郁如负责体例设计和总编纂。

林郁如编写每课中的第一项、第二项(除句型操练部分外)和第三项,并负责编选每课的录相节目和编写相应的习题。

庄鸿山编写每课第二项中的句型操练部分、第六**项**及选注每课的英语歌曲。
