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内容简介

本书收集了500 例语法试题和1000 例词汇试题。考点覆盖全面,重点突出,题目典型,强调精解。 每一题的答案后都给出了详尽的语法解释或词义辨析(包括例句)。

读者对象: MBA 考生;四、六级,在职人员攻读硕士学位人学考试的考生。

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前言

本书是《MBA 联考英语应试教程》系列丛书中的《语法与词汇练习1500 例》分册。

在 MBA 联考英语试券中,语法结构和词汇用法各占试卷总分的 5%, 词汇部分的单词和词组比例为7:3。考试大纲要求,词汇部分,考生应熟练 掌握常用词汇 4500 个左右,其中包括 10%的常用商务词汇;熟练掌握常用 词组600个左右并能根据具体语境、句子结构或上下文理解一些非常用词 的词义。语法部分,考生应掌握名词、代词的数和格的构成及其用法;掌握 动词基本时态、语态的构成及其用法:掌握形容词与副词的比较级和最高级 的构成及其用法:掌握连接词的词义及其用法:掌握非谓语动词的构成及其 用法;掌握虚拟语气的构成及其用法;掌握各类从句的基本用法及强调句型 的结构;掌握常用倒装句的结构。对于考生来说,"语法和词汇"不仅仅是 英语试卷中"结构和词汇"部分的 10 分测试题,作为语言学习的基础,"语 法和词汇"渗透在英语试卷的各项测试之中,它是考生必须要掌握的内容。 考生如果没有一定的语法知识和词汇量、解答"综合完型填空"部分的题目 时,不可能做出正确的选择;做"阅读与理解"部分的题目时,不可能正确理 解文章的含义;应对"翻译"部分的题目时,不可能对句子做出正确的分析; 完成"写作"部分的题目时,不可能准确地表达思想。所谓的应试"技巧", 必须建立在牢固掌握英语基础知识之上,打好扎实的英文功底是提高考试 成绩的关键。

目标

编写这本《语法与词汇练习 1500 例》的主要目的,就是希望考生通过本书提供的练习,系统地、有针对性地掌握英语语法知识和基本词汇,以便在联考中取得理想成绩。

编写本书的另一个目的,是希望总结 MBA 英语应试方法。笔者常年 从事各类考试辅导特别是 MBA 联考考前辅导,在英语基础知识和考试基 本技能的教学上积累了一定的经验,本书是对多年教学经验的总结。

特点

本书的第一个特点是**考点覆盖全面**。编者对考试大纲、历年考题进行了认真分析研究和归纳总结并据此选择题目,力图尽可能全面地覆盖语法 类考点和重点词汇。

本书的第二个特点是**题目典型**。编者在广泛阅读各类语法和词汇练习资料的基础上,从大量练习题中精心筛选出 1500 道练习题。这些练习针对性强,属经典题目。

本书的第三个特点是强调精解,其目的是方便考生自学。毕竟教师在课堂上直接给学生讲解的词汇和语法习题是有限的,更多的东西要靠考生的课下练习。考生在练习的过程中如果发现有疑问,可以通过翻阅习题精解来消除疑惑。此外,对于成年人来说,学习英语主要靠对语言的理解,所以,编者在词义辨析上花费了大量的心血,力图使考生通过本书的练习,充分体会词汇用法上细微的差别。

本书的第四个特点是**重点突出**。在重要的考点上,编者选择了大量练习题,目的是使考生从多方面加以体会,反复训练,加深和巩固对这些重要考点的理解,提高应试能力。

本书在编写过程中结合了多方面人士的意见和建议,得到了清华大学出版社等单位有关人员的大力支持和帮助。责任编辑崔珣丽老师,对本书进行了认真审阅并提出了许多宝贵意见和建议,在此深表感谢。

由于本人水平有限,加之时间仓促,不足之处在所难免,敬请批评指正。
