FOREWORD

This preface must necessarily be short, and modest, for I cannot claim to be an expert in painting, merely an ardent lover of the art. I have spent countless hours of joy contemplating the works of painters in museums or in their own studios, not only in China, but in many other countries as well. I have always felt a deep love and relationship to Chinese painting, even if I am ignorant of the technique and the mastery which are needed to produce such works of art.

Painting in China is one of the oldest arts in existence, unbroken in a tradition of two thousand years. Yet it is only fairly recently that Chinese painting in general, whether classical or contemporary, has been appreciated and understood by a wide public in the West.

And the new development of the art in the last century, especially in the last forty years, is only beginning to be known outside China.

The fundamental difference between Chinese and Western traditional painting is not only the technique, it is a totally different *concept* of what a painting should be. The art in China was dedicated to the expression of an inner vision projected by the artist. It was an art closely integrated to poetry, and it is this linkage which both assured its perennity, but also produced a certain stagnation.

It was always stated with some assurance by Western connoisseurs that there is no oil painting in China, nor could there possibly be the development of oil painting, for an adaptation of such an 'alien form' was unthinkable. Yet this statement is not entirely true.

Oil painting was known and seems to have been practised – albeit on a small scale – in the 18th century under the influence of such Jesuit painters as the renowned Giuseppe Castiglione (LANG SINING). Castiglione became Court painter to the Emperor K'ang Xi, and his paintings were much appreciated. He managed to blend successfully in some of his major works elements of Chinese technique. Some experimentation with painting in oil seems to have taken place then, but the medium was not encouraged later, and the tradition of the painter-scholar, the orthodoxy governing the culture and the arts were too strong to permit any major development.

But now, in the twentieth century, China – as well as the rest of the world – has undergone major changes. For China, a century of turmoil, of political and social revolution, has also affected all traditions including the old traditions of art. This has not destroyed the marvelous achievements of traditional Chinese painting, but it has produced a great hunger for new avenues of expression, new ways of thought and activity, and this of course has meant also a change in artistic vision for the painter, and in the manner in which this new vision expresses itself. And perhaps we are now entering a very important new period of Chinese painting, for all art needs renewal and change, liberation from constant imitation and repetition. Some of the experts I have talked to tell me that 'China is entering a third, most important period of development and creativity in painting and other arts'.

Already in the 1930s and up to the 1950s there were pioneers of 'new' painting in China, a good many of them, influenced by Western art, but clinging to their own Chinese vision, and able to blend the two and thus lay down a new sense of direction, global rather than ethnocentric, for Chinese painting.

But today we are witnessing and extraordinary burst of new creativity in the art, and it is not at all surprising, therefore, that new techniques should be adapted, and with great success. At last, oil painting, a 'western' medium, has been adapted, and most successfully, to the Chinese aesthetic vision. The concepts themselves are changing, not in the way of mere 'imitation', but in a deep and important exploration of the world as it is today, a world which has changed due to the impact of science and technology and the transformations achieved in China itself.

Oil painting does, indeed, impose an adaptation to new ways of expressing the Chinese understanding of Man and Nature. It does mean a new handling of the relation of object and space and perspective. What is fascinating in what I have seen of Chinese oil painting is that already one senses a new creativity coming forth. In New York recently, I found that a small group of connoisseurs were deeply interested in oil paintings by young Chinese artists, precisely because of this new freshness in the use of color, subject, and the emotion which came out of deceptively simple-looking pictures... but which simply touched the heart of the beholder.

Just as we have seen through the turmoil of the last century, the birth of a New China, we now see the renewal of an art two millennia old, but an art also young, young as are the young artists of today who explore the new world which is theirs with their brush, explore it with new techniques, but also with a sense of pride in their own background. They have already absorbed this 'alien' technique, and have done it well, incorporated it within their own consciousness.

I am sure that this collection of oil paintings will have a well-deserved success. It is an immensely important 'beginning', for a new era, bringing added treasures, to the great treasure-trove of Chinese painting.

我在绘画方面谈不上有所专攻,只是热爱这门艺术而已。因此,要为这部画册作序,只能三言两语谈一点肤浅的看法。无论是在中国,还是在许多别的国家,无论是在博物馆,还是在画家的工作室,我曾驻 足观赏许多绘画作品,消磨过不计其数的时光。中国绘画应当掌握的技巧,我知之甚少,但是对于中国的 绘画,我却从来爱之极深,而且备感亲切。

绘画是中国最古老的艺术形式之一,至今已有两千年绵延不绝的传统。然而,西方广大公众对于包括 古典的与现代的中国绘画能够欣赏和理解,却是相当晚近的事。至于最近一百年来,尤其是最近这四十年 来,中国的绘画艺术有些什么新的演进,外国人只是刚刚开始有所了解。

中国传统绘画与西方传统绘画不仅仅在技法上有所不同,两者之间的差异是根本性的,对于绘画之为 何物有着完全不同的概念。中国的绘画艺术所追求的是要表达画家观照的内心世界。绘画与诗歌密不可分, 所谓诗画问源之说,一方面使中国绘画长盛不衰,但另一方面也造成了某种程度的停滞不前。

西方的美术鉴赏家总是一口咬定中国没有油画,而且油画也不可能在中国得到发展,因为要融会油画这种"外来的"艺术形式简直不可思议。然而,这种说法并不完全合乎实际。早在十八世纪,在朗世宁等耶稣会画家的影响下,油画已经传入中国,而且显然已经有人从事油画创作,只不过规模很小而已。郎世宁成了康熙皇帝的宫廷画家,他的画极受赏识。他的若干重要作品巧妙地融合了中国绘画技法,效果很好。当时大概已经就引进油画技法进行了一些探索,但是这种表现手段后来没有受到提倡,文人画的传统作为文化艺术中占据统治地位的一种正统观念是极其牢固的,不容许有任何重大变革。

然而,在二十世纪的今天,中国和全世界一样发生了翻天覆地的大变革。中国经过一百年的风云激荡、 政治革命和社会革命,包括古老艺术传统在内的所有传统都受到了影响。但是这些变化并没有摧毁中国传统绘画的卓越成就,而是激发了如饥似渴的强烈追求,要寻求新的表现手法,探索新的思路和创作方式, 这自然引起了画家们艺术观念的转变,也使表达这种艺术观念的手法发生了变化。如今我们很可能正在跨 人中国绘画史上一个极其重要的新时期,因为艺术总要不断更新和变化,要摆脱墨守成规的模仿,摒弃千 篇一律的重复。有些专家对我说过:"中国的绘画和其他艺术,正在跨入第三个极其重要的发展和创新时 期。"

从本世纪三十年代直到五十年代,中国已经有了大批"新"绘画的先行者,他们虽然受到西方美术的 影响,却坚持中国的观念,而且善于把二者结合起来,从而在中国绘画界形成了一种新的方向,不再囿于 民族中心的心态,而是迈步走向世界。

而今天我们看到的,正是绘画艺术中一股崭新的创造力在无比蓬勃地迸发出来,从而吸收引进新的技法并且取得卓越的成绩,那自然是毫不是奇的了。油画这个"西方"艺术载体终于受到激赏,而为中国人的审美观念所接受。观念本身也在发生变化,并没有停留在"模仿"之一途,那就是要深入地探索今日的世界,并掘其重大涵义,因为今日的世界在科学技术推动之下,在中国自身改天换地的影响之下面貌已经大为改观。

对于表达中国人对人与自然的理解而言,油画确实引进了一种新的手段。对于表现客体与空间及背景的关系而言,油画确实提供了崭新的处理方式。我观赏中国油画之余不禁赞叹不已的一点就是这些作品令人感到一股崭新的创造活力正在扑面而来。最近我在组约看到,有一批为数尚不太多的美术鉴赏家对中国青年画家的油画作品产生了浓厚的兴趣,其原因就是那些一眼望去似乎十分单纯平淡的画作,在色彩的运用,主题的选择,感情的抒发上都散发出一股清新之气,一直沁入观赏者的心脾。

透过百年激荡,我们看到了新中国的诞生,同样地,我们现在又看到了,经历过两千年漫长岁月的中国绘画艺术正在焕发新的生命,中国绘画古老却又年轻,年轻正如今日的青年画家们,他们用手中的画笔,用新的技法,同时也为自己的文化渊源而怀着一片自豪,在开掘他们的崭新的世界。油画这种"外来的"技法已经被他们融会贯通,运用自如,而且在心灵深处同他们溶为一体了。

我深信这一部油画作品集一定会深得好评而当之无愧。在这新时代来临之际,为中国绘画艺术这座灿 烂辉煌的宝库增添更多的瑰宝,的确是一项意义无比重大的"创举"。
