大学英语四级考试是国家教委规定的标准化考试,近年来已经社会化。大学英语四级考试的成绩已成为国家、社会衡量大学毕业生英语水平的唯一标准。随着社会对英语人才的需求,将有越来越多的人参加四级考试。为此逾越英语四级考试大关,是每个大学生取得学士学位、找到理想工作、走向成功的必由之路。
