前言

对于所有的英语学习者来说，词汇都是必须要过的重要一关，可是有些考生在背单词时只重视词义，而忽略了单词记忆的重要部分——词性。于是就有这样的考生——他背了很多单词，也掌握了大量的词汇，但在运用时却常常用错，他会造这样的句子——“This is our produce.”（produce 是动词，怎么能够用在 our 后面呢？），他还会造这样的句子——“The sun provides us with a lot of warm.”（warm 不是名词，不能用在介词的后面。正确的用法是用 heat 来代替 warm）。由这些例子可以看出，考生对单词词性的正确掌握对英语的学习至关重要。

笔者编写这本书的初衷就是希望广大英语学习者在掌握单词词义的同时，能够加强对单词词性的把握。所以本书精心挑选了大量常见的考试必备单词，并将它们按照单词词性的特点进行分类和编辑，使考生能够按照单词的规律性对这些单词进行记忆。同时，在本书中还对近义词和易混淆的单词做了归纳和总结，将更加有效地帮助广大英语学习者提高记忆效率。

acts

[ækts] 行为

ax (e)

[æks] 斧头

One swing of the axe splintered the logs.

2. ad-add

ad

[æd] 广告

The ad for a part-time farmhand attracted several interested people.

add

[æd] 增加

Each year, I add several stamps to my collection.

3. addition-edition

addition

[ə'dɪʃən] 增加

The addition of two clerks in the office will lighten everyone's workload.

edition

[i'dɪʃən] 版面

The morning edition of the newspaper reaches the newsstands very early in the day.

4. affect-effect

affect

[ə'fekt] 影响

Offers of athletic scholarships could affect Jim's decision on which college to attend.

effect

[i'fekt] 后果

Some drugs have the effect of causing sleepiness.

ate

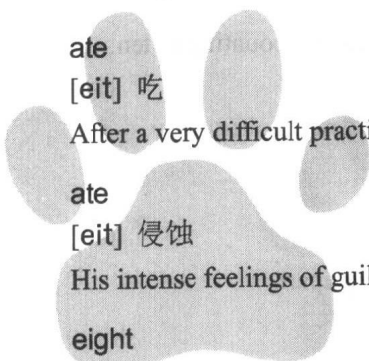
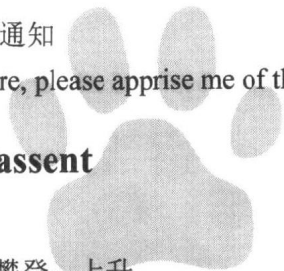
[eit] 侵蚀

banned

[bænd] 禁止

Some cities have banned smoking in public places due to a rising concern over the use and effects of tobacco products.

bare

[bæə] 光秃; 暴露的

Except for some cacti, the desert landscape was bare.

bare

[bæə] 揭露

"I swear I will never bare your secrets to a single soul!" exclaimed his confidante.

bear

[bɛə] 熊

A bear may seem like an awkward animal, but it can move quickly when alarmed.

bear

[bɛə] 承受

Mike is unable to bear much weight on his injured foot.

bear

[bɛə] 忍耐

I cannot bear to see violent movies.

The woman hoped to marry a baron in order to gain some social standing.

bazaar

[bə'zɑ:] 集市

Multitudes of sights, sounds, and smells filled the bazaar in the village square.

bizarre

[bi'zɑ:] 古怪的

The detective had a bizarre habit of inviting suspects to dinner.

1. bell-belle

bell

[bel] 钟

Kathleen has a tiny glass bell and a huge antique school bell in her collection.

belle

[bel] 美女

Amy felt like the belle of the ball when she was asked to dance five times.

2. berry-bury

berry

['beri] 浆果; 莓

The berry of the currant bush makes a tasty, tart jam.

bury

['beri] 埋

To bury one's face in one's hands can be a sign of joy, grief, or disbelief.

3. blew-blue

blew

[blu:] 吹; 刮

A warm wind gently blew the windsocks in the breeze.

blew

[blu:] 自夸

Jeff blew about even his minor accomplishments to anyone who would listen.

blue

[blu:] 蓝色

The clear, sparkling water surrounding the village was an amazing shade of deep blue.

blue

[blu:] 忧郁

The death of her cat made Mary blue.

4. board-bored

board

[bɔ:d] 木板

Bill had some difficulty rounding a corner while carrying the long board beneath his arm.

board

[bɔ:d] 棋盘

The board used to play checkers can also be used to play chess.

board

[bɔ:d] 董事会

The board of directors meets once a month on Tuesday evenings.

board

[bɔ:d] 上（船、火车、飞机等）

No one is allowed to board the ship without first going through a security check.

bored

[bɔ:d] 厌烦的

After just five minutes with her new doll, the child was utterly bored.

5. boy-buoy

boy

[bɔi] 男孩

In some cultures, boys are preferred over girls.

buoy

[bɔɪ] 浮标

When snorkeling or skin diving, a buoy should be anchored near the dive site to alert boaters to divers in the area.

buoy

[bɔɪ] 振奋精神

We tried to buoy his spirits by telling jokes.

6. braise-brays-braze

braise

[breiz] 炖; 焖

I prefer to braise my pot roasts in the oven rather than fix them in a pressure cooker.

brays

[breiz] 发出驴叫的声音

The mule brays loudly each day around feeding time.

braze

[breiz] 用铜焊

Tom used solder to braze the broken hitch together.
