

前言

在学习英语的过程中,读者感到困惑的问题之一是同义词、近义词的辨析。在写作中,有些学生由于不能分辨同义词、近义词的区别,于是便信手拈来,结果是词不达意,不知所云,甚至闹出笑话来,使人误解。为了帮助学生弄清同义词、近义词的区别,提高学生驾驭英语语言的能力,我们编写了这本书。

本书有三个特点。

第一,针对性强。本书紧紧围绕着大学英语四、六级测试中经常出现的同义词、近义词进行比较、对照,辨析其细微区别,重点讲明在用法上的注意事项,希望对参加四、六级的考生有较大的帮助。

第二,取材广泛。本书在编写过程中除了收集并筛选了大量四、六级试题之外,还选用了部分考研及 EPT, TOEFL 试题,也涵盖了一些词在语法上的用法。这样对于参加考研、考托福的学生也一定会有益处。

第三,举例通俗易懂。本书在同义词、近义词的注解部分都举例说明了该词的用法。所举例句或短语力求做到内容新颖。特别是在解释词条的用法时,选用了一些固定搭配或短语作为其例词,尽力避免使用生僻的词和远远超出四、六级大纲的词汇。这样,不仅有助于对词汇的理解,还有助于在写作中使用。

本书的编写从酝酿到成书已历多年,曾经四易其稿,征求过多方意见,恳请广大读者批评指正。
