编者的话

经过一年多的努力,我们终于完成了这套《大学英语考试强化训练》的编写工作。我们期待这套丛书能对立志摘取英语学习桂冠的大学生和研究生有所帮助。

也许有人会问,现在各类大学英语教学辅导书多如牛毛,何必再出这套《大学英语考试强化训练》呢?我们的理由有三条:其一,目前各种辅导书大多是以试卷形式编成的,而按照各种英语技能分门别类地、有系统地编就的辅导书并不多。我们这套丛书能使修学大学英语课程及自修英语的读者根据自己的需要,有目的、有选择地进行有关英语技能的训练并收到事半功倍的效果;其二,本套书所用的材料全部选自近年的英美报刊书籍,不用国内早已被人用熟了的资料,因此,使用本书的读者不仅不会对书中篇章或句子有某种"似曾相识"的感觉,而且还可以在阅读的过程中增长各类最新知识;其三,我们本着切实提高学生的英语应用能力这一原则,在本书的编写过程中,一方面结合目前大学英语考试中的新题型和原有题型来命题,另一方面我们还设计了部分旨在提高学生英语基本功的练习。使用本书的读者会发现,本套丛书所含的题型包括了目前许多考试中的各种常用题型。此外,我们还力图通过设计一些新题型来弥补部分常用题型的不足。

除了可以用于大学英语应考并提高英语语言基本功的训练外,本书还可以作为各界人士攻克其他各类标准化英语考试难关的好帮手。本书各类试题的难易度是根据教学大纲及教材的难易度和词汇量而循序渐进的,但各个级别的划分并不是不可逾越的。修读大学英语某一级的学生可以只做自己本级的试题,也可以视情况做一些其他级别的习题。如把本书作为复习、巩固英语知识和技能的辅助教材,将本书通读一遍亦是大有裨益的。本书编写过程中,余建中教授提供了部分资料,并审订了全稿。

本套书目前已经编就的共有五册:《阅读(1-4级)》,《阅读(5-6级)》,《词汇(1-6级)》,《语法与结构(1-6级)》,《完形填空(1-4级)与改错(5-6级)》。本册《语法与结构(1-6级)》按级编排,每级都有五套试题,包含多项选择填空题、多项选择改错题、按提示填空题以及无选择辨错/改错题等内容。
