



编者的话

《研究生英语听说教程》是《研究生英语系列教程》的其中一本，本教程以《非英语专业研究生英语教学大纲》为指导，根据研究生入学时英语听说能力的实际水平，结合编者几十年来高校英语教学经验编写而成。通过学习本教程，学生能自如地用英语交流思想，获取信息，实现人际交往的终极目的。

《研究生英语听说教程》由 15 个单元构成，各单元题材的取舍与安排、活动形式的设计与定位，都有新颖独到之处。在选材方面，本教程将常规性话题如语言学习、娱乐健康、旅行购物、科学探究、环境保护等与留学海外、人生广角、文化之角、商务活动、缤纷世界等有机地交织于一体，具有时代感、知识性、趣味性及实用性。其口语活动设计的显著特点为：重点培养说的能力，兼顾听、写能力的加强与巩固。

在使用《研究生英语听说教程》时，有一个至关重要的前提：课堂上，有声语言时间占绝对优势。无论是说还是谈、聊，其实实践时间一定要多于听录音的时间。每单元练习的设计已从形式上对此给予一定的保证。对 Part A 部分，教师可采取提问、讲大意、复述某一内容等方法，检查学生课外完成规定任务的情况，使“说在课内占主导地位”的精神得到初步体现。对 Part B 部分，建议在听过录音、写下答案之后，要求学生用英语说出来，以此来检查学生对听的内容是否理解。Part C 是口语活动集中的园地，教师应以灵活多变的教学方法，有效地组织口语活动的开展，并视具体情况进行成对操练、小组讨论、全班汇报、即兴演讲、角色扮演等，将活动开展得有声有色，努力营造出一种轻松活泼的英语学习氛围：让善谈者能畅所欲言，让参与意识稍次者能备受感染，同台共技。

本教程由张珍珍教授、徐丁娟副教授担任总主编，张珍珍教授对本书进行了全面审定。陈瑞萍副教授任本书主编并编写第 1、4 单元，邓长慧副教授任副主编并编写第 9、15 单元。编委分别为（按姓氏笔画为序）王趁红（第 3、6 单元），李加莉（第 8、10 单元），何琼（第 5、7 单元），陈建章（第 12、13 单元），袁晓玲（第 11 单元）以及潘旭光（第 2、14 单元）。
