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前 言

摆在您面前的，是一套外文出版社最新倾力推出的《易速全能英语系列》。

“易速”者，是指本系列编写的目的在于帮助读者“容易”“快速”地掌握英语；“全能”者，是指本系列涉及英语学习的方方面面——动词、名词、形容词、副词、介词、短语、句型、同近义词语辨异、典型错误解析和基础语法。“365”者，是指本系列采用“每天学一点”的形式，使读者充分利用零碎时间，日积月累而增加自己的英语知识，逐步提高使用英语的能力和水平。

本书是《易速全能英语系列》之《同近义词语辨异 365》。

英语和汉语的差异之一，就是英语中存在着比汉语中多得多的同近义词语。这不仅构成英语学习中的一大难点，甚至令人望而却步，而且也是各级各类考试中的失分大户，令人叫苦不迭。

坊间同义词辨异词典林林总总，但其阐释方式多是针对其中的一个单词，从其语义、语法、语用、语体、语域诸方面条分缕析，掰开揉碎，再举上一组例句，然后进入下一个单词，再解说，再举例，洋洋洒洒，直到把一组词全部讲完。（我们姑且称之为“纵向辨异法”）。尽管其阐释可谓准确、详尽，然而读者从头到尾读下来，却往往仍是一头雾水，不得要领。合上书本之后，再难说出一二。究其原因，就是这种“纵向法”只有“解”而缺乏“辨”。

本书则试图另辟蹊径，采用“横向辨异法”，即针对每组同义词语中各词语的“异”点逐词横向而“辨”。例如在含义上甲词如何，乙词如何；在搭配上甲词怎样，乙词怎样；在句型上…；在语气上…等等。我们觉得这种办法会泾渭分明，易懂易记。

本书精选了365组同近义词语，涉及单词近千个。设“释义”“辨析”“例句”和“练习”四个栏目，深入浅出，对比鲜明，一语中的，例句典型，语言地道。读者可结合“例句”细细研读“辨析”，再通过“练习”检查学习效果。每日一组，日积月累，功效自见。

由于编者水平有限，本书所存疏漏之处，诚望读者朋友给予指正。

辨析

这组词都可表示“一(个, 件…)”。其区别是：

- ① 不定冠词 a 用在以辅音音素开始的单词前； an 用在以元音音素开始的单词前；而 one 则不受音素性质的限制。
- ② a 和 an 作为冠词，主要强调事物所属类别；而 one 作为数词则强调数量“一”，可与 two, three 等数词对比使用。
- ③ one 还可用作代词，意为“一个人或物”，以替代某个可数名词，避免重复，其复数形式为 ones；而 a 和 an 只用作冠词，没有复数形式。

例句

① **She is a common worker.** 她是一名普通工人。

He'll be back in an hour. 他一小时后就回来。

We are off one day. 我们休息一天。

② **Have you a bike?** 你有自行车吗？(不是别的东西)

He has one Chinese dictionary. 他有一本汉语词典。(不是两本)

I have two coats but only one pair of trousers. 我有两件上衣，但只有一条裤子。

③ **I want some large ones, not small ones.** 我想要些大的，不是小的。

辨析

这两个词都可指“能够”“有能力的”。其区别是：

- ① able 侧重做事的能力，而 capable 侧重适应性； capable 指满足于一般要求的能力，而 able 指超过一般水平的能力。
- ② able 只用于褒义；而 capable 既可用于褒义，也可用于贬义。
- ③ able 只用于有生命的人或动物；而 capable 既可用于有生命的人或动物，也可用于无生命的事物。
- ④ 用作表语时， able 后接动词不定式；而 capable 后接“of+动名词”。

例句

- ① He is an able man who you can fall back on. 他是个能干的人，你可以依靠他。
 Let me introduce a capable doctor to your parents. 让我把这位称职的医生介绍给你的父母。
- ② He is the ablest man I know. 他是我所认识的最有才干的人。
 The scandal is capable of the basest tricks. 这个坏蛋什么卑鄙的勾当都干得出来。
- ③ There are many able students in our institute. 我们学校有许多有才能的学生。
 Owls are able to see in the dark. 猫头鹰能在黑暗中看见东西。
- ④ The company was not capable of handling such a large order. 该公司没有能力处理这样一大宗订货。

辨析

这组词都可作“关于”解。其区别是：

- ① 用于 *hear, know, learn, say, speak, talk, tell* 等动词之后，*about* 涉及的内容往往比 *of* 涉及的内容更详细。
- ② 用于语言或文字交流如演说、写作等时，*on* 通常指正式的、有准备的、全面的、系统的论述；而 *about* 只是非正式的、无准备的一般涉及，而不作全面的、系统的、深入的探讨。

例句

① **►** *The story tells about a pilot who was wounded during the war but flew again.* 故事讲述了一位飞行员，他在战争中负了伤，但后来又再度飞行。

► *The story tells of the bravery of a little girl.* 这个故事讲的是一个小女孩的勇敢。

② **►** *This is a book for children about Asia and its people.* 这是一本供儿童阅读的关于亚洲及其人民的书。

► *He told me about his adventures.* 他给我讲了他的冒险经历。

► *Have you any idea on the subject?* 关于这个题目你有什么想法？

► *Morse wrote a book on how to lose weight.* 莫尔斯写了一本关于如何减肥的书。

辨析

这组词都可表示“在…上”。其区别是：

- ①表示位置关系时，**over**一般表示“在…的正上方”或“在…垂直上方”，其反义词为**below**；**above**一般表示“在…上方”，只说明物体间的上下关系，可能垂直，也可能不垂直，其反义词为**under**；而**on**一般表示“在…上面”，通常指与物体的表面有接触。
- ②在表示职阶时，**above**只是泛指“高于”，不一定有隶属关系；而**over**则用于有隶属或直接领导关系的情况，有“顶头上司”的意味；**on**一般不用于表示职阶上的高低。

例句

- ① **▲** *The airplane was flying a few feet above the sea.* 飞机正在距海面几英尺的低空飞行。
- ▲** *Carry the umbrella over your head.* 在头顶上撑把伞。
- ▲** *Let us sit on the grass.* 让我们坐在草坪上吧。
- ② **▲** *A lieutenant colonel ranks above a major.* 中校比少校级别高。
- ▲** *Lieutenant Commander Smith is over Lieutenant Black.* 史密斯少校是布莱克上尉的上司。

辨析

这两个词都可表示“收到”。其区别是：

- (1) 从含义上说，receive 只表示“(被动地)收到”这一事实，而 accept 则多了一层主观上“某种程度上甚至完全赞同”的意味。
- (2) 从搭配上说，在表示受到教育、惩罚、支持和接待客人等时，只能用 receive，不能用 accept；而在表示接受某条件时却只能用 accept，而不能用 receive。
- (3) receive 之后还可以拒绝甚至退回，而一经 accept，则除极特殊情况外，一般是不能再拒绝或退回的。

例句

- (1) **I like to receive presents on my birthday.** 我喜欢在我生日那天收到礼物。
He willingly accepted the invitation from his friend. 他乐意接受朋友的邀请。
- (2) **We received a warm welcome.** 我们受到热烈欢迎。
I'll accept the bill only if you send it to my home address. 只要你把账单按地址寄到我家，我就照付。
- (3) **I've received an invitation but I don't think I'll accept.** 我收到一份邀请信，但不准备接受。
The newcomer was reliable. And at last they accepted him. 新来的人是可靠的，他们终于认可了他。
