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

Advertising gives useful information about products. Today's advertisements or sales try to get consumers persuade (诱惑) to buy certain brands (品牌). Taxes, Taxes, and More Taxes.

Americans often say that there are only two things a person can be sure of in life: death and taxes. Americans do not have a corner on the "death" market, but many people feel that the United States leads the world with the worst taxes.

Taxes consist of the money which people pay to support their government. There are generally three levels of government in the United States: federal (联邦), state, and city; therefore, there are three types of taxes.

Salaried people who earn more than a few thousand dollars must pay a certain percentage of their salaries on their salaries. The federal government has a graduated income tax, that is the percentage of the tax (4 to 10 percent) increases as a person's income increases. With the high cost of taxes people are not very happy on April 15, when the Federal taxes are due. The second forty - seven states have an income tax similar to the federal government. Of course, the percentage of the state tax is lower. Other states have a sales tax, which is a percentage charged to any item (项目) which you buy in that state. For example, a person

is buying a coat for \$100. The sales tax is 8%.

- television. And anyone who watches them regularly knows that each one is different in style (风格). But no two shows are more opposite and the Oprah Winfrey shows are as surprising as he is. For example, the show – common talk show – is about a love, sex, cheating and hate at a different level. Clearly the Jerry Springer show is about the dark side of society; yet people are willing to talk the troubles of other people's lives. Like Jerry Springer, Oprah Winfrey takes TV talk show to its top, but Oprah goes in the opposite direction. The show is mainly about the improvement of society and different quality of life. Contents are from talking your children lessons, managing your work, week to getting to know your neighbors.
- Compared to Oprah, the Jerry Springer show looks like poisonous waste being poured into society. Jerry ends every show with a final word. "We have a small speech about the entire show. Hopefully, this is the part where most people will learn something very valuable."
- Clean as it is, the Oprah show is not for everyone. The show's main viewers are middle-class Americans. Most of these people have the time, money, and ability to deal with life's tougher problems. Jerry Springer, on the other hand, has more of a connection with the young adults of society. These are 18 – to 21 – year – olds whose main troubles in life include love, relationship, sex, money and drug. They are the ones who see some value and lessons to be learned through the show's exploration.

- Our bodies are wonderfully skillful at keeping balance. When the temperature jumps, we sweat (出汗) to cool down. When our blood pressure falls, our hearts can do something. As it turns out, though our natural state is always changing, researchers are finding that everything from blood pressure to brain function (功能) changes regularly with the cycles of sun, moon and seasons. And their insights (洞察) are getting new ways for keeping away such common killers as heart disease and cancer. Only one factor in 20 has a good knowledge of the scientific use of time in medicine. But according to a new American Medical Association, three out of four are eager to change that. "The field is exploding," says Michael Sandercock. "Doctors used to look at life like, 'What did you get off?' Now they're thirsty to know more."
- In medical school, most doctors learn that people with chronic (长期的) conditions should take their medicine regularly. "It's a terrible way to treat diseases," says Dr. Richard Martin. For example, patients with hypertension (高血压), may need likely to suffice during the night. Yet most patients try to keep constant level of medicine in their blood day and night, whether by breathing in an inhaler (吸入器) four times a day or taking a pill each morning and evening. In recent studies, researchers have found that a large number of patients with a chronic condition (慢性病) can be as safe as several small doses, and better for preventing nighttime attacks.

If the night attacks belong to asthma (哮喘) the reason is that, "our blood pressure falls at night, unless we start to work at the day." Doctors know that, says Dr. Henry Black of Chicago's Medical Center, "but until now, we haven't been able to do anything about it." Most blood – pressure drugs provide 18 to 20 hours of relief (缓解). But because they're taken in the morning, they're least effective when most needed. You take your pill at 7 and it's working by 9," says Dr. William White of the University of Connecticut Health Center. "But by that time you've gone through the worst four hours of the day with no protection." Bedtime medicine would prevent high blood pressure, but it would also push blood pressure to dangerously low levels during the night.

"There is an out – of – date idea that children grow up and leave home when they're 18, and the truth is far from that," says Mr. Larry Bumpass of the University of Wisconsin. Today unexpected numbers of young adults are living with their parents. "There is a great change in a condition that makes a home and its pleasantness particularly attractive to young people. A divorce (离婚) and a low percentage rate make some differences. For some, the expense of an away – from – home college education has become so great that many students now attend local schools. Even after graduation, young people find their wings tied by terrible housing costs."

Living at home, says Kidzidon, a school teacher, continues to bring some benefits (见下表) and avoid big (大) support. Her mother agreed. "It's a strange for the kids to pay all that money for rent. It makes sense for kids to stay at home." But staying the family home requires changes for all. There are the hassles over bathtubs, telephones and privacy. The ancient Greeks often spoke of the Seven Wonders of the World. Recently, some engineers came up with their own list of the seven wonders of our modern world:

Social support makes up of the exchange of resources among people based on their interpersonal ties; those of us with strong support systems appear better able to adjust with major life changes and daily problems. People with strong social ties live longer and have better health than those without such ties. Studies over types of illnesses, depression to heart disease, show that the presence of social support helps people defend themselves against illness, and the absence of such support makes poor health more likely.

Social support cushions stress in a number of ways. First, friends, relatives and co-workers may let us know that they value us. Our self-respect is strengthened when we feel accepted by others in spite of our faults and difficulties. Second, other people often provide us with information support. They help to define and understand our problems and find solutions to them. Third, we typically find social companionship supportive. Taking part in free-time activities with others helps us to meet our social needs while at the same time distracting (转移注意力) us from our worries and troubles. Finally, other people can give us instrumental support—money and material resources, and needed services—that reduces stress by helping us resolve and deal with our problems.

Many people are interested in family history, an area of study called genealogy (家谱学). The library claims to have the largest collection of genealogical records in the world. Sherry Griffin has more about this unusual research center.



Do you find getting up in the morning so difficult that it is painful? This might be called laziness. But Klemann has a new explanation. He's proved that everyone has a daily energy cycle.

During the hours when you labour through your work, you may say that you're "hot". That's true. The peak of energy is when your cycle of body temperature is at its peak (高峰). For some people, the peak comes during the time before temperature falls to a minimum or evening. No one has discovered why this is, but it leads to such familiar maladies (方言) as "Get up, John! You'll be late for work again!"

The possible explanation to the trouble is that John is at his temperature-and-energy peak in the evening. Much family quarrelling ends when husbands and wives realize what those energy cycles mean, and which cycle each member of the family has.

You can't change your energy cycle, but you can learn to make your life fit better. Habit can help. Dr. Kleinman is right. Maybe you're sleepy in the evening, but feel you must stay up all day anyway. Counteract (抵消) your cycle by sometimes lying down for a short time when you want to. Your energy is low the time when your cycle peaks in the day, before you eat your meal. This won't damage your cycle, just you'll get up steamy (没精打采) and work better than your low point.

Get off to a slow start which saves your energy. Get up with a leisurely yawn and stretch. Sit on the edge of the bed a minute before putting your feet on the floor. Avoid the trouble of searching for clean clothes by laying them out the night before.
