前言

这本英语故事集锦,可以供学龄前儿童、小学学生以及 初中学生参加英语故事大赛使用,也可作为英语课外读 物。

故事大赛一般要求选手们在 5 分钟之内, 用英汉双语讲完故事, 因此本书所选英语故事的长度, 控制在能够让选手们用大约两分半钟讲完, 每个故事后面附有其中文译文。

考虑到参加比赛的不同年龄组选手的英文表达能力, 本书分为三部分:第一部分适合幼儿组的参赛选手,故事简单,浅显易懂;第二部分适合小学组的选手,稍有难度,易于 把握;第三部分适合初中组的选手,在这部分里,有些故事 情节性强,寓意深刻,已具有一定难度。

本书所选故事短小精悍,比较口语化,兼顾趣味性、思想性和知识性,大多是那些流传已久、在世界各国颇受欢迎的童话、幽默故事、民间传说,有一些还是大家所熟悉的安徒生童话、格林童话。这些有趣且有益的故事,在帮助我们提高英语水平的同时,也会让我们在心智上得到良多教益。

学习英语并能够声情并茂地用英语讲故事,是一件有吸引力的事情,也是一个不小的挑战,更是一条学好英语的



佳径。该书还可以作为提高英语阅读能力的读物。在阅读时,只要能看懂文章就可以,不要逐字推敲,这样既可以培养阅读兴趣,又可以避免只见树木不见林。只要持之以恒,定会为以后的英语学习打下坚实的基础。

由于时间和水平所限,疏漏之处在所难免,敬请读者批评指正。



"不是狼啊,"鸭子索尼娅说。"我不是狼,我是你们的朋友。"


彼得、萨莎、伊万和索尼娅一起在树林里走着,忽然又 有一声响动。"狼!"他们大声喊起来。
