

# 前 言

## Preface

《英语相似短语用法例释》可供大、中学校师生及一般从事英语的工作者和英语爱好者使用。

英语中有大量的短语，其中有许多短语结构相似而意义相差甚远，而有的短语结构迥异而意义却又相同或相近。这对英语学习者来说，容易造成理解上的困难。

本书将那些容易混淆的形近义远，形远义近的短语汇集起来，用对比的方式，在意义和用法上做了英汉两种注释，并对有些在用法上容易混淆的短语作了辨析性的说明；有的还给了其它同义的或反义的短语。每条短语都附有例句和译文，帮助读者正确理解。

有的短语有多种、甚至十几种用法，本书不作系统注释。每对短语列举的意义以常用和有对比必要的为限。我们认为这比全面列举语义的方法更便于初学者掌握。

本书是我们在教学实践中根据教与学的需要而编写的，希望对广大的读者也能有所帮助。
