### 前 言

怎样学好英语动词是学习英语的一大难题,也是学好英语的关键所在。 学习英语时遇到的种种困难大都与动词有关:时态语态、非谓语动词、情态动词,虚拟语气、独立结构、动词词组、固定搭配、习惯用法、特定句型等都与动词息息相关,是各类英语考试的考点。因此,本书不仅是一本关于英语动词的书,还是一本与动词有关的词汇语法结构的书,笔者根据多年来教授各类英语课程的经验编写此书,旨在为英语学习者、大中学生、自学考生提供有关英语动词各种要点难点方面的指导与帮助,希望有助于学好用活英语动词,从而提高英语的实践能力、辨析能力和应试能力。

实用性是本书的特点。书中针对中国人学习英语,尤其是英语动词时常见的困惑疑难,结合各类考试的典型试题,以考试题型为主,以简明题解为辅,解决词法、句法、语法的实际问题,既避免了枯燥繁琐的语法条条,又一改急功近利的应试风气,通过科学系统地强化训练,真正做到学好用活英语动词。

本书的实用性不单单限于英语动词的用法,还包括深入探讨了各种与动词相关的疑难杂症。无论是名词、形容词、副词、代词、数词、介词、冠词、连词,还是主语从句、表语从句、宾语从句、状语从句、定语从句、同位语从句,或是强调句式、倒装句型、省略形式,只要与动词有关的难点要点均加以罗列。从英语动词入手全方位展开,以打好基础,真正掌握学好英语的关键。

书中的实用性还体现在突出难点和考点上。凡题中难点均在答案题解中用★号显著列出,以便查阅记忆,其中有语法要点、同义词辨析、固定搭配、动词词组等。凡词典书籍中不易查找的,本书也均列出,甚至佐以例证。例子大多取自各类正式英语考卷,如:大学四级试卷、大学六级试卷、研究生入学试卷、TOEFL等。着重从题型出发,经反复操练,加强记忆,扩大词汇量,掌握正确用法,从而打下扎实基础。

本书共十二套试卷,每套 100 题,分五个部分:填空题、选择题、改错题、翻译题和短文填空。其中纠错题每句仅一个语言错误,需指出改正。翻译题是汉英句子翻译,主要是动词的同字异译,既显示汉英两种语言的差异,又充分体现中英文各自独特的表达方式。

每套试题中附有两篇短文,用以完成动词填空,包括动词的时态语态及各种非谓语形式。全书除二十四篇短文填空外,共有1200题,按1—1200题号编排。各种题例相互关联共同参照,有助于加深了解某一要点难点的各个方面和各种考法,以期获得举一反三,融会贯通之功效。

编者真切希望本书能给读者带来英语学习方面的较大收益,更盼各位专家同行不吝赐教。书稿在电脑打印编排过程中曾得到季方的大力协助,在此深表谢意。
