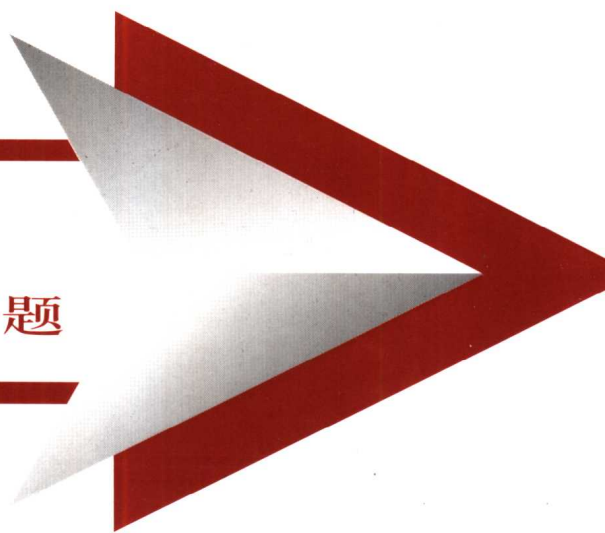

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征服者宣言

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随着全国性的考博热潮的到来,越来越多的人加入到考博的行列中。但是令他们失望的是,目前尚无一本针对考博的英语辅导用书,人们只好拿一些四级六级或硕士研究生入学考试的英语书,来准备博士入学考试。他们迫切需要一本适合博士考试的英语用书,本书就是为了满足他们的需要及时编写的博士入学英语用书。本书有以下三个重要特点。

内容全面、重点突出 作者参考全国十多所重点大学博士入学英语考试试卷,综合各种题型,编写了这本包括听力理解、语法结构、词汇知识、阅读理解、完型填空、综合改错以及英译汉等所有题型用书。另外,在选材上,无论是听力理解,还是阅读理解,无论词汇用法,还是辨别改错,作者都力争做到既内容全面,又重点突出。需要特别指出的,针对重点内容,作者通过不同的题目,从不同的角度、不同的方面来检查,并通过检查来加深读者对这一重点内容的掌握。

详解精解、点面结合 在为试题做精解时,作者坚持这样一个原则:不但告诉读者答案,而且告诉读者解题的思路与方法,要使读者不但知其然,而且知其所以然。因此,在对词汇和结构解析时,作者注重指出试题考查的重点,也就是作者所说的题眼,然后援引经典例句来补充说明。此外,作者还对干扰项,尤其是考查词汇知识的干扰项进行了详细的解析,并给出了恰当的例句。在对阅读理解解析时,在给出参考答案的同时,作者还指出回答问题的关键句,因为找对关键句,意味着成功的一半。针对干扰项,作者会帮助读者弄明白为什么错,错在何处。

新颖版式、别具一格 当读者打开本书时,你就会发现本书的别样版式。无论是试题部分,还是试题解析,无论是正文内容,还是版心以外的名人名言,作者都设计了层次分明、一目了然、易读易学易记的版式,充分展示了本书与众不同的风格,读者会觉得这不仅是一本开卷有益的英语用书,而且还是一件令人赏心悦目的艺术品。另外,为了减少读者的经济负担,全书以16开制版,正文以小五号字排印,版面紧凑,成本低。
