

Passage Two 'Sea turtles' losing the job race

After studying in Australia for four years, in 2000, Zhang Qian returned to Beijing as a 'sea turtle.' She sent out a dozen professionally prepared resumés and was soon summoned for personal interviews with human resources (HR) personnel of one company after another.

Zhang Qian is only one of tens of thousands of 'sea turtles' who have been caught in the great changes that have occurred in China's labour market.

The roughly 7,000 'sea turtles' in Shanghai, China's economic centre, have acquire a new name-'sea weeds,' a pun on hai dai, which is a shortened form of hai gui dai ye, or "returned from overseas and waiting for a job."

Experts here attribute the decreasing salary level for 'sea turtles' to the fact that, with domestic education gradually adapting²⁶ to international practices, students trained in China have become more competitive in the job market.

A Sample Essay

Passage One Divorce rises with changing marriage and love

Between October 1, 2003 and September 30, 2004, within a year of China's new marriage registration⁷ regulations going into effect, the marriage registration centre of Xicheng District in Beijing saw 1,783 couples get divorced, almost double the number of divorce cases in the previous 12 months.

Zhou Baojun, a marriage registration clerk at the Xicheng centre in Beijing, attributed⁸ the higher rate partially to the new Marriage Registration Regulations, which she said have made divorce much easier.
