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口语教程









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随着全球经济一体化的发展和对外交流需求的增加,我国高等院校的英语教学不断面临着新的挑战和更高的要求。社会需要的不仅仅是懂英语的学生,而是需要具有综合能力和丰富知识面、语言能力能适应国外大学研究与学习要求的高素质专门人才。鉴于此,我们邀请一批具有国外知名高校留学经历和丰富教学经验的教师编写了《应用型大学英语口语教程1~4》,以满足各种英语口语交流、出国深造、开展学术研究等方方面面的实际需要。本教材借鉴了国内外同类优秀教材之精华,并参照了国内外口语考试要求,力图实现整体编排科学合理、内容涵盖广泛、设计新颖独特的目标。

《应用型大学英语口语教程1~4》遵循建构主义理论,在多个环节科学安排小组活动练习。本教程遵循听说自然习得顺序和我国学生二语习得的规律设计教学环节,按照"输入"与"输出"理论,保证听力与口语学习的先后顺序和科学合理的重复练习。本教程侧重知识性、实用性和趣味性,力求为学生参加国内有关考试和托福、雅思等国外考试以及接受国外高等教育打下坚实的基础。尤其是吸收了大量的最新实用的英语口语和习惯表达,这也是目前许多国内外英语口语考试和英语听力考试所考查的重点。学习者可以通过本教材的训练,全方位、快速、高效地提高自己的英语口语能力。本教程共包括18个单元,内容既涵盖学生经常用到的各种生活主题,又包括更具深度的国外学习、实际工作和就业等方面的主题。本教程适合大学本科生使用,同时也适用于具有相当英语水平的英语学习者使用。

教材的总体设计与特点:

- 1. 教学环节内容丰富。以培养口语技能为主线,通过各个教学 环节系统地对某一专题进行口语及综合能力训练,培养学生 具有准确的语音语调及朗读、对话、独白、演讲等多方面的 口语技能。
- 2. 单元主题突出。每一个单元围绕一个话题,由浅入深、循序 渐进地使学生沉浸在纯英语语境中,逐步适应英语授课及讨 论的氛围。口语练习量由少到多,难度安排循序渐进,由单 句逐渐过渡到段落,直至语篇的连续口语表达。
- 3. 兼顾全面语言能力培养。教材设计有词汇、阅读、写作等板

块,在培养口语能力的同时,兼顾到学生词汇、阅读、写作等 综合应用能力的提高,训练学生具有综合运用语言的能力。

- 4. 语言材料丰富、语言形式多样化。本教程选用了丰富的口语 化材料,提供了多样化的语言材料样本,同时为学生提供多 种语言操练环境。丰富多样的课堂活动设计使学生在使用语 言中学习、理解并掌握语言,有趣的课堂活动体现寓教于乐 的理念。本教程配有CD光盘。
- 5. 本教程与《应用型大学英语听力教程1~4》相辅相成,两者单元话题一致,词汇结构既有重复又增加多样性,更适合"听"与"说"两种语言技能的相互融合与相互促进。
- 6. 本教程特别聘请英国斯特林大学著名学者、权威英语语言教学专家Blair Robertson作为主审。在教材的编写设计、语言的地道性等方面给予重要的支撑。

教材的结构编排:

本教程每个单元由Warming-up、Oral Translation、Theme Reading、Group Work及Speaking and Writing等五部分构成。Warming-up为导入阶段,帮助学生尽快熟悉单元话题和相关词汇结构;Oral Translation要求学生对单元话题进行口译练习,调动学生课堂参与积极性;Theme Reading为学生提供单元相关主题的精选语料,是学生练习朗读的理想材料;Group Work为学生提供对话模板及对话情景,要求学生根据情景进行创造性地对话、小组讨论等活动,培养其学以致用的能力;Speaking and Writing为学生提供口语与写作相结合的训练,提高语言综合能力。

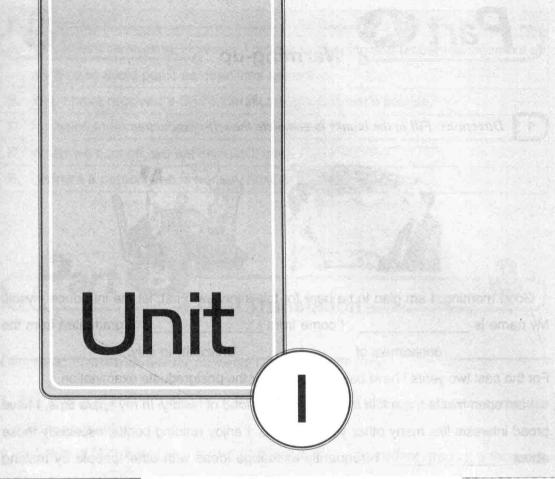

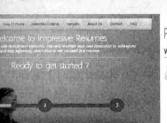

Once you have been invited to an interview you must get ready to create the impression of someone they will surely want to hire above all other job applicants.

Self-description in your introduction is the key to interview success. They should have read your resume and the cover letter you sent in, but that only gave them enough information to want to see you in person. Now you are going to meet the HR manager in person, and you have one



chance to impress the interviewer and persuade him you are the person he want to employ. As you know, interviewers will often rely heavily on their first impressions, to the extent that the interview becomes merely a confirmation of that first impression, either good or bad.

So if self-introduction is your key to interview success, the first and most important aim is to create a positive first impression.

Everybody has an opinion as to how you do that: look them in the eye, give them

a firm handshake, speak up and don't mumble; be prepared. Prepare exactly what you are going to say. Do not tell some lengthy story about your life. Keep it short and show that you are interested in both the job and the organization. Don't forget to include some examples of your strengths and achievements which relate directly to the requirements of the new job.

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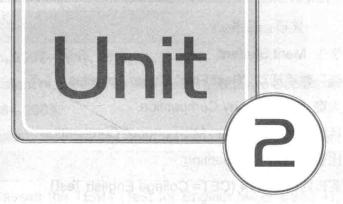
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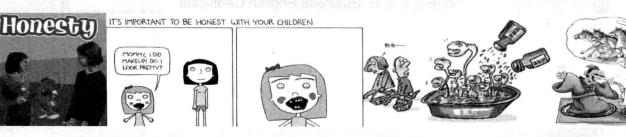
