前言

大学英语教学大纲颁布以来,我国已举行了多次检查学生基础阶段英语水平的四级考试。为了提高学生的实际英语水平,培养学生的应试能力,帮助学生掌握大纲词汇和基本语法,我们特编写了这本《四级英语词汇测试》。

全书共分两部分。第一部分,以大纲词汇为依据, 参照几套大学英语精、泛读教材,编写了约3000道词汇、 语法结构练习题,并配有答案,以方便读者的独立训练。 第二部分,选编了一部分常用的构词前缀、后缀与词根, 以帮助读者记忆单词和扩大词汇量。

本书可供广大大专院校非英语专业的学生和具有同等英语程度的读者使用。
