Preface

The best way to build your English reading and vocabulary skills is in an interesting, informative and entertaining way. Both levels of the book series feature fascinating articles and beautiful pictures designed to inspire readers.

Levels 1 & 2 of Reading Comprehension Practice each contain 80 articles that are divided into eight categories. For this book, Level 1, the titles for the various sections are: Art & Culture; Celebrations; Just So You Know; Innovations; Sports & Leisure; The Origins; Travel; and Features. From their very beginnings to the fascinating acts of today, circuses have been one of the most popular forms of entertainment ever.

Throughout time, people have enjoyed being entertained¹. Whether with laughter, amazement, or fear, entertainment always draws² a crowd. From their very beginnings to the fascinating acts of today, circuses have been one of the most popular forms of entertainment ever. The first records of circuses are from ancient Rome. Chariot³ races, animal shows, jugglers⁴, and acrobats⁵ made up⁶ these first performances. The events were held indoors and were open to all social classes. After the fall of Rome, however, these were lost to Europe.

Circuses made a comeback⁷ in England in the 18th century thanks to Philip Astley. He was the first to introduce trick⁸ horse-riding to the show and created the famous circus ring⁹ in which the performances were held. He then added clowns, trained animals, tightrope¹⁰ walkers, and tumblers¹¹. This was the official¹² start of the modern circus.

The next big step for circuses was taken by P.T. Barnum in the US. He brought the circus world the sideshow¹³, where strange animals and humans could be seen. He also was the first to use trains to

transport his circus from town to town. With Barnum, everything was bigger and better, which is reflected 14 in his circus' nickname, The Greatest Show on Earth.


