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前言 Foreword

2004 年，国务院学位办对考试大纲进行了修订，发布了《硕士专业学位研究生入学资格考试指南（2004 年版）》，适用范围除工程硕士外，还增加了农业推广和兽医专业硕士。2005 年 GCT 考试沿用了 2004 年考试大纲。GCT 考试作为国务院学位办新实行的一种考试，考试名称虽然在原来的基础上去掉了“工程”二字，但其考试对象主要还是工程硕士考生。

自 1997 年国务院学位委员会正式通过设置工程硕士专业学位以来，到 2012 年全国已有 314 个工程硕士培养单位，涉及 40 个工程领域，共招收工程硕士研究生 60 万余人，累计授予工程硕士学位 20 万余人。

GCT 入学资格考试试卷由四部分构成：语言表达能力测试、数学基础能力测试、逻辑推理能力测试和外语运用能力测试。GCT 入学资格考试中的英语运用能力测试，旨在考查考生目前所具备的英语语言基础、英语阅读水平和英语运用能力。英语运用能力测试共有四部分：词汇与结构、阅读理解、完形填空和会话技能。考试题目共 50 个，考试时间 45 分钟。考试大纲的重大改革，要求考生不仅要了解新的考试要求和形式，还要针对新的考试形式做好备考训练。
