PREFACE #1

非常感谢大家使用《E时代大学英语》系列教材。

随着信息时代的来临,大学英语的教学理念、教学方法、教学模式和教学技术都发生了很大的变化。为了实现《大学英语教学指南》提出的要求,大学英语教学不仅要帮助学生打好语言基础,更要与现代教学技术结合,注重培养学生的学习兴趣和英语应用能力。这就要求我们对大学英语教学进行改革与创新。

大学英语教学的创新首先是教材的创新。为此,我们潜心多年,对市场上的大学英语教材进行了充分研究,并走访了众多院校,举办了数场大学英语教学改革和教材编写研讨会,与众多英语教学专家和优秀一线教师反复讨论、研究,编写而成《E时代大学英语》系列教材。

《E 时代大学英语》系列教材体现了外语教育者在教材改革方面所做的开拓创新尝试,借鉴近年来大学英语教学改革的成功经验与教学实践的成果,使用多样的教学手段和创新的教学方法,力求提升学生的英语综合应用能力,支持教师提高课堂教学质量,推动大学英语教学迈向新台阶。

本系列教材理论、结构、教法互为依据、互为完善、互为转换,构成了一个灵活、方便、高效的 教学系统。

一、《E时代大学英语》系列教材简介

《E时代大学英语》系列教材以教育部颁发的《大学英语教学指南》为指导,在设计和编写中准确把握大学英语的课程定位和性质,深入分析教学目标和教学要求,总结归纳课程结构与内容,采用多种教学方法和教学手段,力求将能力培养和能力测试紧密结合,以促进大学生知识、能力和综合素质的协调发展。


该系列教材包括《E时代大学英语——读写教程》《E时代大学英语——视听说教程》《E时代大学英语——阶梯阅读教程》《E时代大学英语——快速阅读教程》和《E时代大学英语——综合训练》。

二、《E 时代大学英语——读写教程》特色

《E时代大学英语——读写教程》结合现代高等教育教学的特点,融入了全新的教学理念、教学方法和教学技术,具有鲜明的时代性、思想性、实用性、渐进性、趣味性、多样性和精美性,并配有丰富的数字化教学资源。其特色具体表现在以下几个方面。

1 选材新颖、紧跟时代

本套教材充分考虑了时代的发展和新一代大学生的特点,在介绍前沿的科技进展、管理经验和思想理念的同时,兼顾学生的认知和兴趣,既考虑到语言形式的多样化和复杂性,也照顾到选材的新颖



性和趣味性。力求引发学生共鸣,激发学习兴趣,并能学习和了解世界优秀文化和文明,树立先进的世界眼光。

2 思想碰撞,文化交流

本套教材在贯彻其工具性,提高学生英语听、说、读、写、译能力的同时,注重其人文性,强调语言作为文化载体的作用,旨在充分挖掘大学英语课程丰富的人文内涵,实现工具性和人文性的有机统一。

在学习、交流先进的科学技术或专业信息,了解国外的社会与文化、增进对不同文化的理解、对中外文化异同的认识、培养跨文化交际能力的同时,还积极响应中国文化"走出去"的国家战略、增加具有中国特色的题材,让学生在英语学习中不断积累中华文化知识。鼓励学生进行中外文化思想的碰撞、观点的交锋,使学生具备了解国外文化和信息的能力和将中国文化和特色传播出去的能力,促进与各国人民的广泛交往,提升国家软实力。

3 学练结合,全面提升

本套教材在内容设计上富有层次感,按照循序渐进的原则,各册教材的语言难度随着学生英语水平的提高而逐步增加;练习形式丰富多样,内容安排环环相扣,重在提高学生语言能力;技能培养系统全面,提供学生写作、阅读等方面的技巧,培养学生的英语综合运用能力。

4 活动丰富,操作性强

本套教材体现以教师为主导、以学生为主体的教学理念,每个单元均设置了丰富的活动,这些活动都经过精心设计,既有趣、贴近学生的实际生活和将来的职业应用,又方便教师在课堂上实施,从 而可以一方面调动学生课堂学习的积极性,另一方面能最大程度地提高学生的英语实际应用能力。

5 Internet+, 资源齐全

本套教材除了在"硬件"的纸版教材上精益求精外,还大力开发"软件"的学习资源,充分运用数字化教学资源,包括微课、课件、在线考试系统、在线教学和学习平台等,凸显现代学习方式的互动性、移动性、随时性,以丰富教师教学手段、提高学生学习效率。

6 图文并茂,版面精美

本套教材图文并茂, 版面活泼生动, 采用全彩印刷, 印制精美, 令人赏心悦目。

三、《E 时代大学英语——读写教程》单元结构

本套教材每册包括六个单元,每个单元包括 Lead-in、Study Focus、Ability Enhancement、Grammar and Translation 四个基本模块。单元的设计和编排既考虑到题材多样性和难易度,也照顾到策略训练的先后顺序,从而有针对性地加强学生英语读写能力的培养。

- △ Lead-in 以讨论、对话等多种启发性活动(配合视频短片)引入单元主题,旨在激发学生的 学习兴趣,并引导他们对本单元主题进行思考。
- △ Study Focus 包括精读和泛读两个部分,每部分内容均包括一篇课文(提供课文和生词音频及背景相关视频)和相关练习。选篇内容新颖,难度适宜,能有效地帮助学生打好语言基本功;练习形式多样,联系学生实际,有效提高学生的课堂参与度。

- Ability Enhancement 为综合性语言锻炼项目,包括歌曲欣赏(含音频或 MV)、电影欣赏(含精选电影片段)、口语练习与主题写作四个部分。电影赏析深化主题,口语练习形式多样,主题写作系统实用,旨在全方位提升学生的英语应用能力。
- Grammar and Translation 为语法和翻译的理论知识讲解。语法点拨部分系统介绍了语法的基本知识,让学生在语言使用上更规范;翻译技巧部分介绍了常用的翻译技巧,旨在提高学生的翻译能力。

本书由牟道玉、徐郑慧、商亮担任主编,由宋秀静、尹美娜、王静、王小红、潘文霞担任副主编。 无论我们如何追求完美,书中仍可能存在不完善和疏漏之处,敬请各位读者给予指正。此外, 在编写本书的过程中,我们借鉴了一些文献资料,在此向这些文献的作者表示最诚挚的谢意。



Online Class, Love It or Hate It?

- I'm not a big fan of online classes, but I don't hate them **entirely**¹ either. My first experience with online learning was two years ago when I took a **journalism**² course online. That semester started in August and by early September I dropped the course.
- Last semester I took another online class and that didn't go very well either. Both times I found myself struggling with the material, and communicating with others in the class as well as the instructor³, and if your school has a finicky⁴ web interface⁵, that can be

a problem too.

- Communication is a big part of learning, whether you're forming study groups with other students in the class or meeting your professor in his or her office hours. In an online class, you can't raise your hand and expect a response on the spot. It's also tough to talk to other students and even meet new people in online classes as students may not check their web messages often enough.
- And not everybody can run to campus to meet up either as there are those who are taking online classes for geographical⁷ reasons. Students are usually given the instructor's e-mail and sometimes their phone number, but e-mail responses can be slow or the instructor may be too busy to talk on the phone. These problems aren't the instructor's fault⁸. They're the basic problems of online classes.
- My problem with online classes was that it didn't fit the way I worked as a student. I'll be the first to tell you that I procrastinate a bit. It's an awful epidemic across all campuses, I'm sure, but procrastination is a little riskier in online courses. Since all the assignments in an online class are most likely already dated it's probably easier to schedule all the work, but like the smart guy I am, I usually waited until the night before to finish the homework. Am I just lazy? Partially¹², but not totally.
- You see, in online classes, there's no physical instructor there to push the student forward. Students in an online course have to be more self-motivated¹³ and focused. Having an online class also takes you out of the classroom. This is a disadvantage 14 for me because I feel like I learn the best in a classroom environment, away from the usual distractions 15 of music, video games and television.
- 7 Learning on the web also feels disconnecting and that was a feeling I couldn't overcome. I perform best when I'm told exactly what to do and I like to talk to the instructors and ask questions on a whim¹⁶, and as mentioned before, it's not as easy to do online.
- Online classes also hold the possibility of completely failing depending on the school's network and web interface. There was a time when I was still at a community college that the online learning website was crashing17 and having issues, students weren't able to log18 into their courses.
- Now this may not happen to you, but relying so heavily on the web can be problematic¹⁹. What if you lose your internet connection? What happens if your computer crashes while working on an assignment? These are problems that can affect offline classes, yes, but it has bigger impact when you are learning online.

- Despite my dissing²⁰ online learning in the last 500 words, there are a lot of things I like about the idea of online classes. Only with online classes can you learn in your bed, in your pajamas²¹; online classes give you a lot more freedom²² than traditional²³ classes.
- Online classes also allow those who are too busy to go to campus to continue their schooling²⁴ at a time that is more appropriate²⁵ for them. Online classes also have the luxury²⁶ of being virtually²⁷ limitless²⁸ as there are no classrooms with limited²⁹ seating so just about every student can sign up without much worry.
- Personally³⁰ I'm not a huge fan of taking online classes but I can definitely see the convenience³¹ and advantages³² of doing so. But what about you, dear reader?
