

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说明

小学英语PEP同步系列读物 Read Me 是依据国家《九年义务教育英语课程标准(实验稿)》的一、二级语言技能中对阅读的能力要求编写的,配合人民教育出版社出版的"(PEP) PRIMARY ENGLISH"教材,并与该教材单元教学同步使用。本读物以单元的话题为主题,在单元学习的基础上,以不同形式和题材扩大学生的阅读量和学习视野,并让他们从中获得乐趣,达到培养和发展学生初步的阅读技能的目的。训练的形式包括帮助学生预测阅读内容,理解阅读材料大意,读懂简单的细节以及理解文中的指代等。本书从五年级开始编写,每学期一册,共四册。

本书共有六个阅读话题: "How Do You Go to School?", "Where Is the Science Museum?", "What Are You Going to Do?", "I Have a Pen Pal", "What Does She Do?"和 "The Story of Rain"。本读物体裁多样,包括配图说明、短文、故事、诗歌、图表、标示等。每单元分三部分:第一部分Topic time。这是课文的话题的扩充内容,如文化背景知识、生活常识等,并有一些检查理解的题目。第二部分Story time。这是与话题有关的一个幽默故事。有些故事的主要人物就是课本中的Zip和Zoom。第三部分Fun time。这是与话题相关的配图诗歌、谜语、笑话、游戏、绕口令、图片等,读起来让人感到轻松、愉悦。


















Binbin Travels to London

school. But how do so many children go to the same school at the same time?


Zip: Good question! The mayor of the city knows this. He asks people there to build some subways,

There is a parking building beside each gate.


Do you know the use of the gates?






Unit 2 Where Is the Science Museum?
