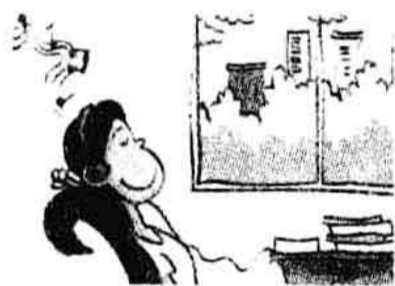

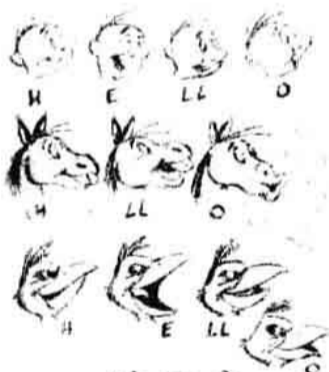

1 Save Money for College on My Own



Finally, I was 'off to college. Thanks to careful 'savings, I did 'not 'have to work |during the 'first school year. Then, 'summer hit |and it was 'time to work 'harder |than 'ever. I continued working as a 'waitress at 'night, as a 'tennis 'instructor |during several 'mornings a 'week and worked as a 'secretary for a few hours in the 'afternoons. ¹⁾ Being a little 'overzealous, I decided to also take a 'class at a community college. This class at the community college saved me \$ 650. It was an 'exhausting summer |and made me 'anxious |to return to my relatively 'easy life at college.

During my 'second and 'third years |of undergraduate schooling, I decided to work about 'five hours per 'week |in the campus 'admissions 'office |answering phones. This provided a little 'spending money |and kept me from 'draining my savings. The overall situation looked 'hopeful |as I approached my 'senior year |as long as I could make as 'much money |as I had the 'previous summer. That is 'when I decided to go to Israel |to study for 3 weeks. I 'hesitated in making this decision |and had just about decided 'not to go |because it would 'cost me \$1,600 'more |to get the credits in Israel. About two weeks later |my Mom called to tell me |that I had \$1,600 in the 'bank |that I had

'forgotten about. One of my concerns about this trip|was not 'on-ly the 'cost, but the 'time it could take to 'make money; howev-er, I made as much that summer|in the 'ten weeks that I was home|as I had made during the 'fourteen weeks|that I was home|the summer before. The 'way everything worked out|to make this trip 'feasible|was one of the 'most 'exciting things|that has 'ever happened to me.

This experience has shaped me|in many 'important ways. The 'first thing that I learned|was the 'importance of a strong work 'ethic. Working long hours did a 'lot to 'mold my character |and helped me learn the value of a 'dollar.² It also made me learn|how to craft 'creative solutions|to 'difficult 'dilemmas.

自己挣钱上大学

我终于跨进了大学的校门。由于精打细算，大学第一年里我没有去打工。但等暑假到来时，我得更拼命地去打工了。晚上的时间我一直在餐馆当服务员，每周有几个上午去当网球教练，下午做几个小时的秘书。¹ 因为太过心急，我还决定去一所社区大学带了一门课。在社区大学带的这门课为我攒下了 650 美元。这个暑假我过得精疲力尽，于是我盼望着回到相对轻松的大学生活中去。

大学的第二年和第三年，我决定每周在校招生办工作大约 5 小时，负责接听电话。这样我可以挣点零花钱，不必动用积蓄。等进入第四学年时，总体形势是比较乐观的，只要暑假能再挣到上一个暑假那么多的钱就好了。就在那时我有了去以色列学习 3 个星期的打算。不过对此我犹豫不决，曾打算放弃，因为去以色列修学分要多花 1600 美元。大约过了两个星期，我妈妈打电话告诉我，说我在银行里还存有 1600 美元存款，而我早把它给忘了！对于以色列之行，我的顾虑之一不只是费用，还有用来赚钱的时间。然而，那个暑假在家乡我用 10 个星期挣下了相当于上个暑假 14 个星期挣的钱。每件事情的完美解决使我的以色列之行得以实现，这曾是经历过的最激动人心的事情之一。

在许多重要的方面，这种经历影响着我的发展。首先我认识到

了高尚职业道德的重要性。在我性格的形成上,连续数小时的工作起了重要作用,并且它让我懂得了每一美元价值的价值。我还学会了在遇到困境时如何想出富有创意的解决办法。

2 Competition
