


## Dialogue P


Mrs Zhou: Yongxian always gets up at six thirty. Tom: Six thirty! I never get up before seven thirty! **Tom:** What are these?

**Rose:** This evening? We usually go shopping at the weekend.


Yongxian: In China the shops are still open in the evening. Mum,






# How Many Terms Do You Have in a School Year?
