

画速写是每一个画家最重要的基本功之一,是每天的日课。速写不单单是"快画",那几笔中包含着全部的素描 因素。从解剖、透视到运动规律,再到构图和面部表情、人体动态等等。可以说你的功夫如何,水平高低,画几笔速 写就一清二楚了。不论你属于哪一画种,都要具备一流的速写功底。我们常说的:心、眼、手的统一,眼看到、心里 想到、手能跟上,能快速捕捉生活中的一瞬间。三下两下就把对象按在纸上,可谓简练扼要。

史村在基础训练上,下了不少苦功,短短的几年时间里,画了几十本速写,几麻袋速写和习作。对艺术的痴迷和 热爱极近疯狂。尤其对欧洲古典素描做了大量研究。荷尔拜因、安格尔、门采尔、德加、康波夫都是他最爱。功夫不负有心人,经过这些年的刻苦努力,已经初见成效。

史村勤于思考,喜欢读书。同时做大量的学习笔记,这一好习惯,不但加强了自身的文化素养,也为他在今后的 艺术道路上奠定了良好基础。

打开这些速写本,那些鲜活的形象就会跃然纸上,生动传神,呼之欲出。还有那些人物众多的场景,安排得疏密 有度,处理得轻松流畅。很多速写本身就可成为一幅独立作品。

史村是我的儿子,也是我的学生,是我教学生涯中遇到的最用功、勤奋的学生之一。美术界的人都知道当年我很用功,画速写用麻袋装。其实史村比我更用功、更执着,区别是我们所处的时代不一样。我年轻时,写实主义绘画是主流,大家都画速写,同学们都是你追我赶,相互学习,互相鼓励,每人进步都很快。现在不同了,当今的画坛是以西方现代观念为时尚,不重视基本功的训练,急于求成。照相机代替速写本,脱离生活、脱离传统。写实主义已不是主流绘画。在诸多的美术院校里已找不到几个爱画速写而且坚持画速写的学生了。在这样的环境下,像史村这样执着,是很苦的。但我知道他能坚持下去。

这本小集子,只是史村投身绘画艺术的一个阶段小结。后面的路还很长,相信他在艺术上不但会超越父亲,而且会比我走得更远!更远!

A few strokes can contain many elements; from anatomy and perspective to the law of motion, composition, countenance, body movement, etc. Thus the abilities of a painter can be seen clearly from a simple sketch. 

The drawings found in his sketch books are so vivid that they seem ready to come out at one's call. Many sketches themselves can be treated as independent works.














拿烟袋的老人 Old man with pipe
