编写说明

五年制高等师范学校经过二十多年的探索与实践,已经成为我国培养专科层次小学、幼儿园教师的骨干力量。为进一步提高人才培养的规格与质量,我们组织编写了本套五年制高等师范学校基础阶段教材。

编写五年制高等师范教材是适应基础教育课程改革的需要。我国基础教育课程改革顺应时代发展的要求,着眼于培养一代新人,描述了新的课程框架,提出了课程功能的转变等具体目标,引发了基础教育人才培养内容和方式的深刻变革。课程问题最终是教师的问题。我们应当适应基础教育课程改革的需要,努力构建新课程理念下小学教师的培养模式和课程体系。

编写五年制高等师范教材是适应小学教师专业化的需要。教师专业化是世界教师教育的潮流。小学教师专业化与中学教师专业化是有区别的,小学生的依赖性和向师性,对小学教师专业情意的要求更为鲜明;小学教育的趣味性和艺术性,对小学教师专业技能的要求更为全面;小学教育的基础性和全面性,对小学教师专业知识的要求更为综合。因此,我们要认真研究小学教师的专业特点和要求,在专业化视野中探究小学教师教育的理念和方法,深化五年制高等师范的教学改革,加强小学教育专业建设。

五年制高等师范教材的编写努力体现"五年一贯"的思想。我们的基本构想是前三年以基础性为主,兼顾选择性,后二年以选择性为主,兼顾基础性。前后衔接,融为一体。 作为系统工程的一部分,我们先行开发基础阶段的部分教材,以后将逐步探索,构建整体的教材体系。

为编写五年制高等师范教材,我们在充分调研的基础上,聘请了师范院校具有丰富教学经验和较高学术水平的学科带头人分别担任学科教材的主编,从事教学的一线骨干教师参与编写,同时聘请专家进行审定。由于时间仓促,难免存在不足之处,请在使用中提出宝贵意见,以便修订完善。

前言

《五年制高等师范教材·英语》是由译林出版社严格按照教育部颁布的《高职高专教育英语课程教学基本要求(试行)》(以下简称《基本要求》),并参照教育部颁布的《中等职业学校英语教学大纲》和《全日制普通高级中学英语课程标准》而编写的一套专供五年制高等师范学校使用的非英语专业系列规划教材。系列教材以国内外先进的英语教学和学习理论为指导,体现以学生为中心的教学理念,以培养学生的英语综合运用能力为最终目标。系列教材强调结合五年制高等师范的教学实际,汲取同类教材的优点,努力建设成为五年制高等师范英语精品教材。

本系列教材共分四册。每册有两本学生用书:《英语综合教程》和《英语拓展教程》。 其中《英语综合教程》配有教师用书。

《英语综合教程》采用听说、读写主题搭配,以话题为主线,穿插语言功能训练,引导任务型教学。《英语综合教程》力求融合听、说、读、写、译等各项技能,各单元自成一体,整本教材及系列教材兼顾各项语言技能的系统性。《英语拓展教程》补充拓展《英语综合教程》涉及的各项语言技能,进一步强化语言综合能力的训练。

《英语综合教程2》各单元板块内容如下:

(1) Listening & Speaking

听说部分紧扣单元主题,精选与主题相关的核心语言功能和典型情景,采用生动多样的形式,循序渐进地展开听说训练,以有效提高学生的听说能力。Getting into the Topic 呈现了主题相关的基础且实用的词汇、句式和语言功能,供学生熟悉、记忆和进行口语模说训练。Testing Your Ears采用任务型听力理解训练模式,遵循听力理解的规律,注重培养学生听的习惯,真正提高听力理解能力。Putting It Together有机整合了听说训练,通过输出性训练实现语言知识向语言能力的转化。

(2) Reading

本部分结合学生实际,以有趣的Warming Up为导入,激活学生的背景知识,激发学生学习的兴趣。Warming Up还包括了对主课文的预读理解训练,鼓励学生整体把握课文的主题脉络或核心细节。Reading Through中的主课文选材兼顾趣味性、时代性和实用性。内容丰富,题材多样,贴近学生实际生活,有利于学生将语言知识应用于现实,从而提高语言的应用能力。

课后设置Understanding the Text和Vocabulary and Structure两项练习,分别考查学生对课文内容的深入理解以及对本单元所学重点单词、词组和结构的掌握。

(3) Grammar in Use

Grammar in Use 突出语法学习的趣味性、实用性和系统性。该部分除了帮助学生系统地复习已学语法知识外,还循序渐进地提供必要的补充和提高训练。本部分语法知识的讲解努力结合各单元主课文中的语言现象,讲解条理清晰,并引导学生通过实际应用,在理解、掌握实用的语法知识的基础上,把语法知识转化为语法能力。

(4) Writing

本部分前两项练习精选课文中出现的结构和搭配,通过组合句子和翻译等形式训练学生的写作能力。后两项练习则另辟蹊径,以英语的基本句型为主线,循序渐进,由浅入深地帮助学生理解、熟悉并最终掌握英语的基本结构,培养构建正确英语语句的能力,实现提高学生英语写作能力的目标。

本教材附录词汇总表按字母顺序排列,覆盖各单元听力部分和课文中出现的单词,并 对单词分级标注,标明了出处,便于学生有重点地学习和掌握。

《五年制高等师范教材·英语综合教程2》的主编由拥有丰富英语教学经验的韩旭教授担任,副主编由周彬副教授和周韵副教授担任。本书力图整合先进的教学理念,采用全新的教材编写模式,但在实际编写中难免有疏漏不当之处,我们由衷期望本系列教材的使用者提出宝贵意见。


