

本书为"高校专科英语实用教材"系列之一。

全书共有 25 个单元,每 5 个单元后附一套侧试题。本书侧重于打语 言基础,立足加强语言基本功训练,选材广泛,内容由浅入深,讲求实效, 并注意材料的思想性、科学性、知识性和趣味性, 练习编排合理, 题型 多样。

本书适合高等专科(高职高专)学生及广大英语爱好者使用。

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
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科(高职高专)教育是我国高等教育的重要组成部分,是以培养适应生产、管理、服务领域劳动第一线的高等技术应用型人才为目标。其特点是:以素质教育为基础,以能力培养为中心,以岗位需求为依据;遵循"打好基础,强化能力,立足实用"的原则;强调知识的综合性、能力的应用性。经过近年来的实践,高校专科英语教学取得了明显的进步,但传统的本专科教材与之并不相适应,因此很有必要编写、出版一部适用的基础教材。《高校专科英语实用教材》便应运而生了。

本套教材根据教育部 2000 年颁布的《高职高专英语课程基本要求》(下称《基本要求》)进行编写。全套教材分为三册,每册分"读写"和"听说"两部分,重点参照《基本要求》的 B 级要求进行编写。编者希望通过本套教材的使用能使学生达到以下要求。

- (1) 巩固基本的英语语法和必须掌握的基本词汇。
- (2) 能听懂简短的英语对话,并能用英语进行简单的口头交流。
- (3) 能阅读中等难度的英文材料,并能撰写常用的英语应用文。
- (4) 能借助词典翻译中等难度的一般性英文材料。

此外,编者还希望学生在校期间坚持学习英语,较好地掌握和巩固基础阶段所学的知识和技能,力争达到《基本要求》的 A 级标准,为毕业后的实际应用和继续学习打下良好的基础。

本着上述目的,本套教材在选材方面力求做到题材广泛、内容新颖丰富、知识性和 趣味性并重,力图为学生提供一定的跨文化背景知识,使学生不仅从语言知识和技能层面,还能从文化素养层面具备英语交际的能力。

本套教材的"读写教程"每册设计 10 个单元,每单元 3 篇课文,均紧扣某一主题。 每篇课文之后均编排了练习,这些练习具有较强的针对性,以利于学生巩固所学知识。 本套教材的"听说教程"从最基本的语音训练开始,循序渐进,涵盖了日常生活的各种 主题。

本书在编写过程中,得到了美籍专家 John Rondema 和 Patricia Rondema 的大力支持, 他们提出了许多宝贵意见。在此,我们全体编者向他们表示最诚挚的感谢。

本套教材的编写是在云南省教育厅有关领导的直接指导和组织下进行的,目的是推动云南省高校英语教学的改革和发展。我们在此对他们表示衷心的感谢。由于时间仓促,本教材中的错误在所难免,恳请各院校师生提出宝贵意见。






