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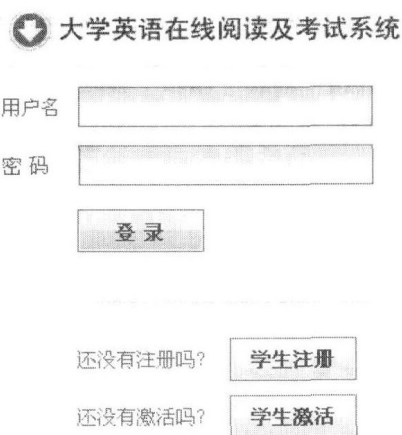
大学英语在线阅读及考试系统学生使用说明

大学英语阅读教程由网络在线阅读及考试部分和纸质教材部分组成。本教程每一册含八个单元、一次期中考试和一次期末考试。每个单元含五篇文章,其中纸质教材上有三篇阅读材料,分别为深度阅读、快速阅读和美文赏析,前两篇学生需在网络系统上提交答案;网络在线阅读及考试系统上有两篇阅读材料,分别为深度阅读(网络版)、快速阅读(网络版,限时完成),这两篇学生需在网络系统上完成阅读并提交答案。期中考试和期末考试均在网络系统上完成。

大学英语在线阅读及考试系统是一个大学英语自主学习平台。学生通过本系统,可在网上完成大学英语阅读教程的学习、考试并查看自己的成绩。关于其使用方法说明如下。

一、在线注册

学生需在每学期开学后进行一次注册(对应每一册教材及开课班级),具体步骤为:学生通过校园网访问到大学英语在线阅读及考试系统首页,如图1所示。点击“学生注册”按钮,进入到注册页面,如图2所示。在该页面中输入相关信息(在英语教学班的下拉列表框中选择希望加入的教学班级),点击“注册”按钮(如果学生是第一次注册,当注册成功后就完成了班级的申请,等待老师处理。老师批准则申请通过;老师拒绝则申请失败,这时学生应当选择另一个班级,重新申请,具体步骤见第六点“学生修改教学班级”),学生完成注册,系统跳转到激活页面,如图3所示,在激活册数下拉列表框中选择需激活的册数,输入激活码(粘贴在每一册书籍上),点击“激活”按钮,这样学生就激活了相应册数。

二、在线完成阅读练习及考试

学生通过校园网访问到大学英语在线阅读及考试系统首页,以自己注册的学号作为用户名登录系统。当登录系统成功后,就进入到学生功能页面,如图 4 所示。学生可以在该页面中选择相关菜单以实现相关功能。

点击“在线考试”按钮，显示在线考试的页面。如果此时页面显示为如图 5 所示（提示“请激活第×册”或者无提示信息，但无法显示第×册及单元），则说明学生在注册完成后，并没有激活需练习或者考试的第×册，这时可根据需要激活相应的册数，具体方法有两种：

（1）请点击“在线考试->请激活第×册”按钮，如图 5 所示。系统跳转到如图 3 所示的页面，在激活册数下拉列表框中选择需激活的册数，输入激活码，点击“激活”按钮即可。

（2）请点击“查看成绩->请激活第×册”按钮，如图 6 所示。系统跳转到如图 3 所示的页面，在激活册数下拉列表框中选择需激活的册数，输入激活码，点击“激活”按钮即可。

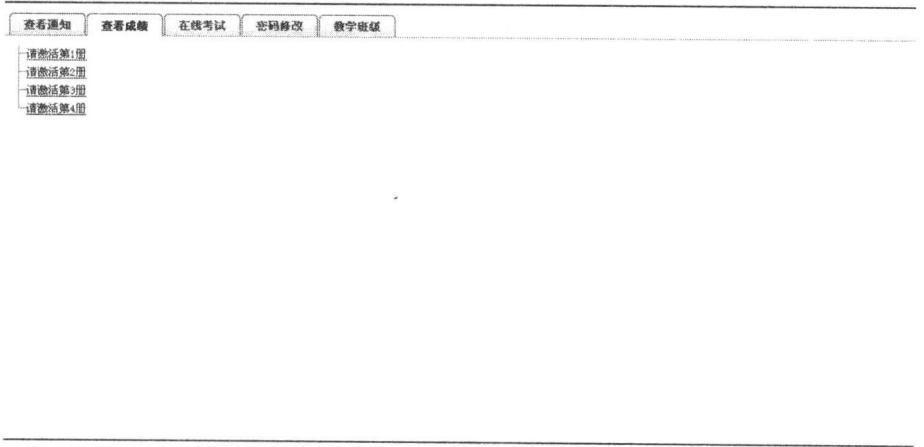

当学生完成了相关册数的激活，并成功登录系统后，应点击“在线考试->第×册（已激活）->第×单元”，再点击题目类型（比如深度阅读2（网络）），此时会出现两种情况：

（1）如果老师还没有批准该学生加入班级，那么系统将显示为如图 7 所示。在这种情况下，该学生应当及时与开课老师取得联系，一旦确认老师拒绝其加入该班级，则应选择另一个班级重新申请，具体步骤见第六点“学生修改教学班级”。

（2）如果老师已批准该学生加入班级，那么系统将显示出单元的相关题目，这时就可以开始阅读练习或考试了。如图 8 所示。

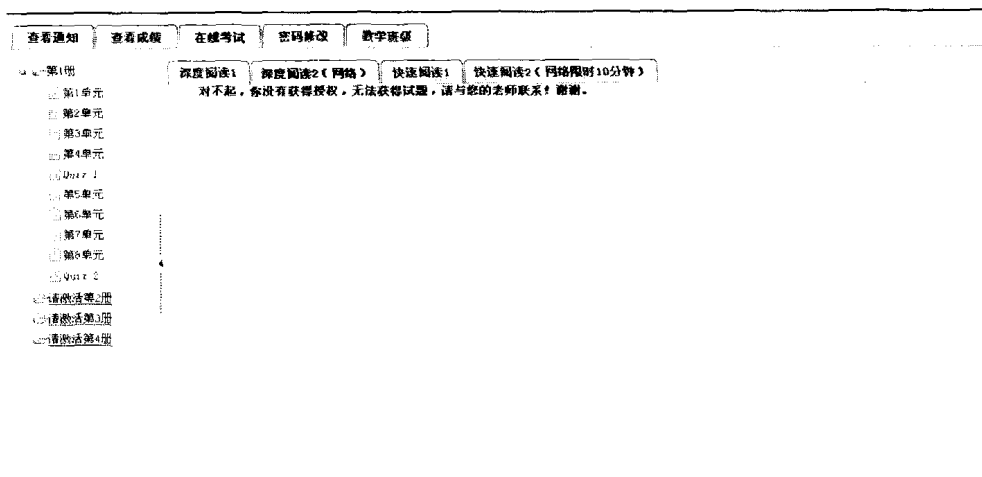

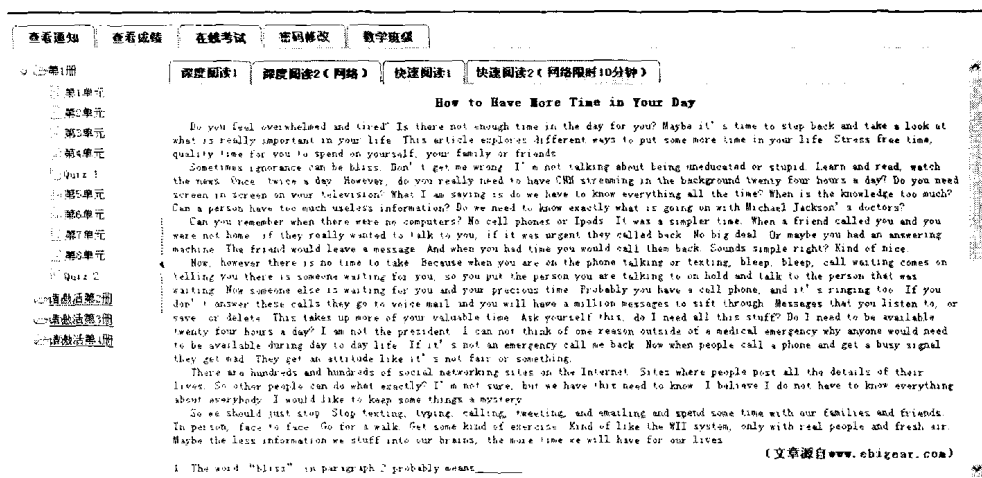

当学生完成某册的阅读并提交答案后,如果还需要继续学习其他册,这时就应当申请其他册所对应的开课班级,具体步骤见第六点“学生修改教学班级”。

需要说明的是:本系统上,大学英语阅读教程每册题目含8个单元、期中考试(Quiz1)和期末考试(Quiz2),如图8所示。每个单元包括4篇文章,分别为深度阅读1(纸质)、深度阅读2(网络)、快速阅读1(纸质)、快速阅读2(网络限时10分钟),每篇文章有5道单选题,点击各个选项即可实现答案的选择并提交。其中深度阅读1和快速阅读1,只需在网上提交答案。深度阅读2和快速阅读2必须在网上完成阅读并提交答案。期中考试和期末考试均包括5篇文章,全部在网上完成考试并提交答案,其中快速阅读1和快速阅读2限时10分钟完成。

三、在线查看成绩

当学生完成考试后,就可及时查看自己的成绩。具体步骤为:点击“查看成绩”按钮,选择相关单元后就可以查看已经考试过的成绩。如图9所示。

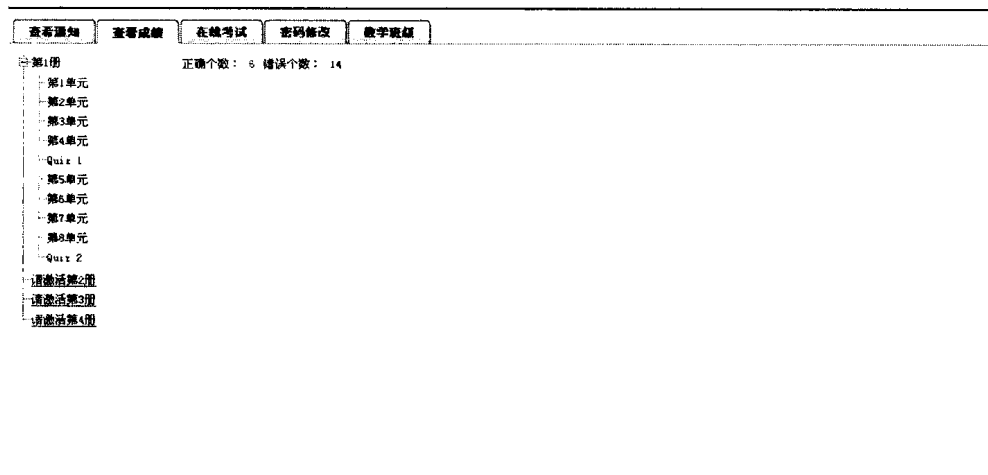

四、在线查看通知

学生登录到系统后,点击“查看通知”按钮可以查看老师发布的通知。如果通知中包含有附件,点击通知中的附件名称就可以下载该附件。

五、学生修改个人密码

学生可对个人登录密码进行修改,点击“密码修改”按钮,在相应页面里输

入相关信息，点击“修改”按钮即可。

六、学生修改教学班级

在教学过程中，如果学生需要转班，那么可修改教学班级。点击“教学班级”，系统显示修改英语教学班级页面，如图 10 所示。在该页面的英语教学班下拉列表框中选择班级即可。

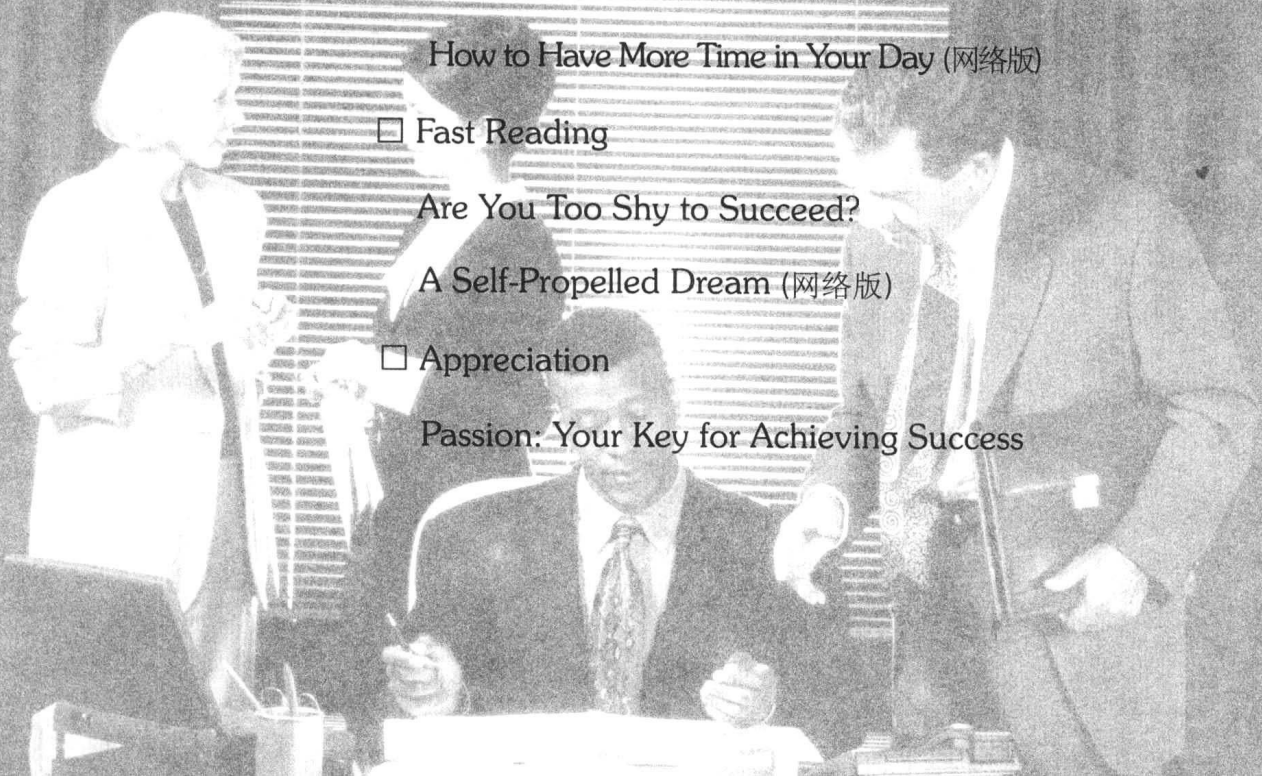
