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# 前 言

《北美名校商学院留学申请论题回答范例》是MBA申请人不可或缺的一本留学申请参考 书。MBA申请人在申请MBA人学时都会面临相同的问题,即国外大学一般都会要求申请人 回答一些ESSAY题目,例如:申请人的学业/职业生涯规划和MBA有何关系?为什么要申请 该校的MBA?申请人最大的工作成就是什么?这些ESSAY题目可以说是千奇百怪,各种问题 都有,这点通过翻看本书目录部分即可了解。为了让申请人最大限度地了解到不同学校的 ESSAY题目,笔者搜集了包括哈佛大学、斯坦福大学、西北大学、宾夕法尼亚大学及伊利诺 伊大学芝加哥分校等大学的全真ESSAY题目,共有数百道。类似北卡大学的分析并购案、加 利福尼亚大学伯克利分校的名句感言等都是很难回答的题目。尽管每所大学所出的ESSAY 题目不同,但还是有其相似之处,为了方便读者参阅,笔者将这些ESSAY题目进行了分类 处理。

本书的重点在于提供真实的ESSAY回答范例,这些范例是申请人在申请这些学校时写 出来的,笔者略加修改整理编辑成书。当然有的范例太长,有的范例太差,笔者都重新写过 或整理过,目的是希望每一个范例都能实现最佳参考价值。同时,为了体现MBA ESSAY的 真实性及多样性,笔者尊重原ESSAY提供人的文字资料,对范例中的文法瑕疵未多做修改, 这点还要提醒读者特别注意。尽管本书的范例大部分都来自美国的大学,但是英国及欧洲的 MBA ESSAY题目也涵盖在这些题目的范围之内。在本书的最后,笔者列举了一些英国及欧 洲MBA ESSAY的题目以供参考。不管您是要留学美国、英国、欧洲或中国大陆的中欧管理 学院,只要申请的是需要回答ESSAY的MBA课程,本书都将是你的最佳参考资料。看看别人 如何回答,你自己也会文思泉涌!

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# 北美名校商学院留学申请论题

## Harvard University 哈佛大学(P22-31)

- 1. Please describe three different leadership experiences that have been significant for you. Feel free to draw on work, personal, or extracurricular activities. (300-word limit) What did you learn as a result of these experiences? (300-word limit)
- 2. Recognizing that successful leaders are able to learn from failure, describe a situation in which you failed. (100-word limit) Why did you fail? (200-word limit)
- 3. Describe a situation when your values and/or beliefs were challenged. What did you do, and why? (300-word limit)
- 4. Describe your three most substantial accomplishments and explain why you view them as such.
- 5. What are your career aspirations and why? How will you get there? (300-word limit)
- 6. (Optional) Is there any other information that you believe would be helpful to the Board in understanding you better? Please be concise.

#### (Harvard Essay 2002)

- 1. Choose a recent experience in which you acted as a leader. Briefly outline the situation, describe your leadership role, and then explain how you were effective and what you learned. (300-word limit)
- 2. While recognizing that no day is typical, describe a representative day. (300-word limit)
- 3. We all experience "defining moments," significant events that can have a major impact on our lives. Briefly describe such an event and how it has affected you. (300-word limit)
- 4. Describe a setback, disappointment, or occasion of failure that you have experienced. How did you manage the situation, and what did you learn from it? (300-word limit)

#### Stanford University 斯坦福大学(P31-34)

- 1. What matters most to you, and why?
- 2. Given your reasons for earning an MBA degree, what type of alternate preparation might you seek if formal MBA programs did not exist?
- 3. GMP (suggested length: 500 words) Describe your interest in global management and how you intend to use your GSB/GMP experience to prepare you to manage more effectively in the global environment.
- 4. PMP (suggested length: 500 words) Describe your interest in public service and how you intend to use your GSB/PMP experience to help prepare you for a leadership role in public service, whether in business, government, or the nonprofit sector.

# University of Pennsylvania 宾夕法尼亚大学(P34-39)

1. Please discuss the factors, both professional and personal, influencing the career decisions you have made that, in turn, have led you to your current position. What are your career goals for the future, and why is

now the appropriate time to pursue an MBA at the Wharton School? How will you avail yourself of the resources at the Wharton School to achieve these goals?

- 2. Describe a situation where leadership and teamwork were critical to the outcome of a project which you were directly involved. What did you learn from the experience and how have you applied what you learned to other situations? (1,000 words)
- 3. Describe a personal achievement that has had a significant impact on your life. In addition to recounting this achievement, please analyze how the event has changed your understanding of yourself and how you perceive the world around you.

The Admissions Committee believes the required essay topics address issues that are important in understanding your candidacy for the MBA Program at the Wharton School. ## Massachusetts Institute of Technology 麻省理工学院(P39-41)

As technology, innovation, globalization, and entrepreneurial opportunity become more important, managers need to understand how to develop new management models and methods and to make them work. Explain how the MIT Sloan MBA Program's focus on innovation will help you achieve your career goals.

Question 2: Describe a situation where you introduced and/or managed change in an organization. Tell us how you influenced others in an organization (business, school, extracurricular activity) and comment on the professional and/or personal attributes you used to do that and how these attributes (and others) might be important to the attainment of your career goals. How do you expect the Sloan School to further the development of these attributes?

# University of Michigan 密歇根大学(P52-56)

# Cornell University 康奈尔大学(P56-59)

- 1. Why are you seeking an MBA from the Johnson School? What do you hope to experience and contribute here and what are your plans/goals after you receive your degree? What factors have influenced your career decisions to date?

Discuss the impact of technology on your chosen career and how your study at the Johnson School will help you face the challenges and opportunities in the new millennium.

- 3. Answer one of the following two questions:
  - a. At the Johnson School we highly value the spirit of entrepreneurship. Review the following George Bernard Shaw quote: "The people who get on in this world are the people who get up and look for circumstances they want, and, if they cannot find them, make them." Then describe a professional situation in which your actions were instrumental in crafting the outcome.
  - b. The Johnson School is well known for its leadership curriculum and for building great business leaders. Please describe your most significant leadership experience. Feel free to draw upon work experiences, extracurricular activities, or your personal interactions in describing a period of formal or informal leadership. Please focus on what caused you to be effective.
- 4. Optional essay: If there is other information you would like to add regarding your candidacy, please use the optional essay. For instance, if you believe one or more aspects or your application (e.g., undergraduate GPA or test scores) do(es) not accurately reflect your potential for success at the Johnson School and in your chosen career, you may use this essay to explain those circumstances. You may also include background information you would like the Admissions Committee to take into consideration as it reviews your application. This essay is for clarification purposes only.

# Dartmouth College 达特茅斯学院(P59-61)

- 1. Discuss your career progression to date. Elaborating on your short and long term goals, how do you see your career progressing after receiving a Tuck MBA?
- 2. What qualities will the 21st century demand of its business leaders? To what extent have you demonstrated these qualities through personal and professional interactions? How do you envision your Tuck experience preparing you to become such a leader?
- 3. What are your interests outside your job or school?
- 4. Optional. The Admission Committee welcomes any additional comments you may wish to provide in support of your application. If your credentials and application represent you fully, do not feel obligated to write anything more.

# Duke University 杜克大学(P61-64)

- 1. Please discuss your previous professional experiences, your long-term career goals and the role the MBA will play in those plans. Why are you interested in the Fuqua School of Business and what do you hope your contribution will be to an MBA environment? If you are interested in the Health Sector Management concentration or a joint-degree program, you should address that in this essay. (Limit 4 pages)
- 2. Tell us about the most challenging team experience you have had to date. What role did you play? What factors made in a challenge for you? How did you and the group address these issues? What did you learn? (Limit 2 pages)
- 3. Choose one of the following three questions:

a) Discuss a personal failure that had an impact on your professional practices or management style. Why do you consider the situation a failure? How did you resolve the situation? Did it change your professional outlook? If so, how? (Limit 1 page)

b) Discuss the most significant personal or professional risk you have taken. What was the outcome? How did this change you as a person? (Limit 1 page)

c) The Fuqua Admissions Committee defines leadership as having a measurable, positive impact on one's community or professional organization. How do you exemplify this definition of leadership? (Limit 1 page)

#### **Essays for Re-Applicants**

- 1. Please write an essay updating the Fuqua Admissions Committee on your professional activities during the past year. (Limit 2 pages)
- 2. Write an essay outlining in what ways you feel you are a stronger candidate for admission as opposed to the previous years' application. (Limit 2 pages)

# University of California, Los Angeles 加利福尼亚大学洛杉矶分校(P65-68)

- 1. Please provide us with a summary of your personal and family background. Include information about your parents and siblings, where you grew up, and perhaps a highlight or special memory of your youth. (Limit two pages)
- 2. Discuss a situation, preferably work-related, where you have taken a significant leadership role. How does this event demonstrate your managerial potential? (Limit one page)
- 3. Describe your most significant personal accomplishment to date, explaining why you view it as such. (Limit one page)
- 4. Discuss your career goals and why you want an MBA, particularly at this point in your career. Why, specifically, are you applying to the Anderson School? (Limit two pages)
- 5. (Optional) Is there any other information that you believe would be helpful to the Admissions Committee in considering your application? If you feel the application already represents you well, do not feel obligated to answer this essay question.

Describe how your previous experience will help you to reach your goals. (Length: three pages, typed and double-spaced.)

2: We believe that the best Education for leadership in any sector of the world economy is two years of rigorous business fundamentals. This approach to learning will prepare you for any career you might pursue, be it in the business, government or nonprofit arena. With this in mind, tell us why the Yale MBA program is the right learning environment for you. (Length: two pages, typed and double-spaced.)

3: Part of leadership is the ability to make a difference under difficult circumstances. With this in mind, describe a situation in which you exhibited such leadership. (Length: one page, typed and double-spaced.)

4: From a professional standpoint, answer one of the following questions: a. Describe a risk you took. b. What motivates you? (Length: one page, typed and double-spaced.)

5: (optional) Is there any information not presented elsewhere in the application or any aspect of your credentials that needs an explanation to help the Admissions Committee understand your candidacy?

#### Carnegie Mellon University 卡耐基梅隆大学(P81-83)

- A. What are your reasons for undertaking MBA study at Carnegie Mellon? Please describe how your experience, education and graduate training at Carnegie Mellon and your future career plans relate to each other. Describe your short-term objectives and how you plan to achieve them.

- 1. Which of Kenan-Flagler's Core Values: excellence, leadership, integrity, community, or teamwork has been most important for your career development to date? How do you expect this value to figure in your future development? (Two pages.)
- 2. What is it about your background and your experiences that would make a contribution to the diversity of the entering class and the educational experience of the other students? (Two typed double-spaced pages.)
- 3. You are the senior marketing officer at Levi Strauss Corporation, a manufacturer of casual apparel. Nike Corporation has proposed an alliance in which your two companies will introduce a co-branded line of sports apparel in Europe. You are responsible for evaluating the pros and cons of this potential alliance and for recommending a course of action to the CEO. You have two weeks to respond to Nike. What factors will you consider? What resources will you use? How will you present the analysis? What action will you recommend? (Three typed double-spaced pages.)
- 4. Two of your largest competitors are merging. You have been asked to brief your company's board of directors on the implications of this merger on your company. Describe the process you would follow in

order to assess the implications. Mention the areas you would explore, what questions you would raise and where you would go for answers. (Three pages max.)

- 1. Please include any other information that you believe would be helpful to the Admissions Committee in considering your application. (One page max.)
- 2. If you have had international exposure through living or working abroad, please tell us about your experiences. (One page max.)

# University of Texas, Austin 德州大学, 奥斯汀校区(P88-90)

- 1. Explain how obtaining an MBA at the McCombs School of Business will assist you in achieving your personal and/or professional life goals. Why is now the best time for you to pursue this degree? Your explanation should include, but is not necessarily limited to, a description of both your intermediate and long-term career goals, as well as a current vision of your desired employment upon graduation.
- 2. All students bring a unique personal background to the classroom and study team that can prove to be as enlightening to fellow classmates as their professional skills.
