導 言

對於英語的初學者，以及很多已有一定程度的學習者而言，當他們在和說英語的同伴對談時，與活用英語上，經常會犯了一些奇怪、滑稽和令人咋舌的錯誤。他們常常會使用錯誤的單字，錯誤的詞類變化，錯誤的文法形式，或者一些不正確的發音。閱讀「測試您的英語實力！」這三本書後，將會使每位英語的學習者都能正確的掌握，並且克服上述的一些常犯的錯誤。英語知識的累積也將藉由最有效的方法，有系統的建立起來。

這三本書的測驗原理，是採用多樣選擇的方法。也就是說；在每一道英文題目之後，必須從五個選擇項目之中選出一個正確的答案來。然後對照後面的解答，可以自己檢查答案是否正確，那裏也說明了選擇正確答案的理由何在，以及其他相關問題的解釋。

本書所採用的方法，有別於傳統的學習方式。它們是

活潑的，有趣的，是學習英語的最佳捷徑。採用問題的方式，是爲了讓讀者能不定期的自我測試，即使是在短短的時間裏，亦可充分的利用。俾能使讀者花最少的時間，而收到最大的效果。

另外，本書的選題方法是建立在現代語言學的知識基礎上。作者布魯坦（G. Broughton）是英國倫敦大學英語教師學系主任。作者其他許多成功的英文教材，正嘉惠着全世界衆多的英語學習者。

「測試您的英語實力！」系列三書，依據其困難度，由淺入深，循序編輯而成。讓讀者能從自我測試當中，了解英語的真髓所在。

第1級——是給初級程度者的一本測試手冊

第2級——是給中級程度者的一本測試手冊

第3級——是給高級程度者的一本測試手冊
