# 前 盲

《英语练习集》(吉林人民出版社,1984)出版以来,对硕士学位应考生总结、复习及提高英语水平起到了一定的作用,受到广大读者的欢迎,曾几次重印。其间虽做过一次增补,但随着学生英语水平的日益提高,原书已不能适应读者的需要。近几年,我们在教学实践中不断补充、深化,又积累了不少素材,现将它们整理、汇编,作为原书的续集出版。

作为原书的续集,本书在编排方式上大体保留原有格式。 实践证明,这种安排便于系统化总结所学知识。内容方面, 根据近年来入学试题的发展趋势和进一步提高英语水平的需 要,对词汇部分做了深化,并增加了介词、连词、词语用法、 词语搭配等章节,以利于读者掌握英语中繁多的词语现象, 提高理解和运用英语的能力。

作为教学实践的产物,本书内容大部分经过课堂实践。 这次出版,又做了必要的精选和补充,以满足不同水平读者 的要求。书末附有答案和1987年硕士生入学试卷,供读者参 考。

本书是为准备参加硕士研究生入学考试编选的,同时也 可作为大学非英语专业高年级英语教学的辅助教材或参考资 料,并可供广大有志于提高英语水平的自学者使用。


