前 言

本书以多种日常话题为主线安排设计,以全面培养高等院校学生在英语听说方面的实际运用能力为宗旨,以听带动说,使学生不仅能听懂英语,而且能就某一话题有话可说。全书共分为28个单元,每个单元包括听力微技能、单句听辨、段落听辨、实战考场等版块,前12个单元还设置了语音训练,以帮助学生正确发音,为提高听力奠定扎实的基础。为方便学生对照自学,书中附有答案及听力原文。

- 1. 教学和应试紧密结合。书中引入 IELTS、TOEFL、PETS、大学英语四六级等常见考试的听力测试,使学生在提高听力的同时可熟悉和体验各种考试题型及难度。
- 2. 话题广泛。既包括传统的衣食住行及媒体、时事、政治、网络等热门话题,又包括同类书较少涉及的感情、智慧、个性、动物、音乐等专题论述。
